A Message from Andrew Spires

I don't know how much experience you may have had with an axe during your lifetime. The first one I ever purchased was nothing more than a small camp hatchet that I thought looked cool to take in the woods and cut small pieces of wood for a campfire. As I got older I started my first job as a surveyor's assistant. This sounds like an amazing position for a high-school kid who worked on the weekends, but all that title meant was that I got to carry all the heavy equipment and cut a lot of trees. This was my first exposure to a real axe. I learned a very important lesson quickly, a dull axe works you to death! This reminds me of a story I once heard.

Once, many years ago before the advent of chainsaws, there was a young man who needed a job and approached the foreman of a logging crew to ask for a position. The foreman handed the man an axe and told him to cut down a tree. The young man showed impressive strength and stamina and made quick work of the tree which crashed to the ground with a great thud! Impressed, the foreman hired the young man on the spot and put him to work the following week. Weeks went by, in the beginning, the young man was one of the most efficient lumberjacks they had. However, soon the average number of trees he processed daily began to shrink. Soon, the foreman called him over to his truck and told the young man it just wasn't working out. Shocked, the young lumberjack pled his case; "I come in early, I work through my breaks, I stay late, I do whatever it takes to get the job done." The foreman explained that his numbers had fallen off which was usually a sign of apathy or laziness. The young man took off his hard hat, wiped his brow, and scratched his head. Suddenly, something occurred to the foreman and he asked the young man; "Have you been sharpening your axe?" The young man immediately felt stupid as he responded that he had been too busy to even think about it. He was busy, working himself to death with a dull instrument, and his performance was suffering.

Life becomes a lot like this story. We get so busy that we don't take time for the most important things. We seem to be busier than ever but less content and happy than ever. We all need time to focus on what really matters. In our study of the book of Ephesians (5:15-16), we are reminded; "Be careful, then, how you live—not as unwise, but as wise, making the most of every opportunity because the days are evil." We are also told in Proverbs 27:17; "As iron sharpens iron, so one man sharpens another." In the busyness of this life, let's not forget to sharpen ourselves on the Word of God, through prayer, through corporate worship, and fellowship with other believers. We all need a time of refreshing that reminds us of our ultimate purpose of glorifying Christ until He comes.


Ephesians 3:20 Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us,
