A Message from Dr. Jerry Horner

I was preaching in Denver, Colorado. Seated near the front was a dainty elderly lady, exquisitely dressed, complete with hat and gloves. I learned later that she was 93 years old. During the altar call she came with a sincere prayer request. "Please pray," she requested of me, "that God will send me a godly husband." I couldn't help but think that here is living proof of the old adage, "Hope springs eternal," remembering also, "Delight yourself in the Lord, and He will give you the desires of your heart." We prayed, but I never learned the results. At least she had hope.

There are thousands of inspiring quotes about hope, and they all encourage a positive attitude, which is good. A morbid attitude is a time waster, and it breeds only darkness and defeat. As Dwight D. Eisenhower stated, "Pessimism never won any battle." Here are just a few representative quotes about hope: Albert Einstein, "Learn from yesterday, live for today, hope for tomorrow. The important thing is not to stop questioning." Alfred Lord Tennyson, "Hope smiles from the threshold of the year to come, whispering, 'it will be happier.'" Charles Dickens, "It's always something, to know you've done the most you could. But, don't leave off hoping, or it's of no use doing anything. Hope, hope to the last."

The Bible also has a lot to say about hope, as you can see from consulting a concordance, but there is a difference between biblical hope and hope as an optimistic outlook. In earthly language, hope communicates a note of uncertainty, as in "I hope that something might happen." But biblical hope is the glad assurance that something will happen. In other words, it's the difference between hope as wishful thinking, without any concrete assurance that the thing hoped for will take place, and hope as a future fact waiting to happen. The Bible says that God is the God of hope (Romans 15:13), and God does not inspire uncertain wishes.

Biblical hope arises both from things that God has done and from God's promises yet to be fulfilled. When we see the mighty deeds that God has accomplished, the certainty of our hope is strengthened beyond doubt. This is especially true with the greatest event of all, the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Paul wrote, "If in this life only we have hope in Christ, we are of all men the most

pitiable" (1 Corinthians 15:19). In other words, without the resurrection, the future is fearful and fruitless. There is no hope if this life is all there is. "But now Christ is risen from the dead, and has become the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep" (1 Corinthians 15:20). The resurrection of Christ has taken the sting out of sin, the gloom out of the grave, the dread out of death, and it has given to us a hope that is steadfast and sure. We have an eternal hope of knowing that this world is not our end, but that when all is said and done that we have a home in glory and a life that is beyond what mortal words can tell.

There is another event yet to come, which the Bible calls "the blessed hope," identified as "the glorious appearing of our great God and Savior Jesus Christ" (Titus 2:13). What God promises, God will perform. Jesus said He would return (John 14:3), the angels said He would return (Acts 1:11), and the epistles repeatedly say that He will return. There is no doubt that the Lord will return, "and everyone who has this hope in Him purifies himself just as He is pure" (1 John 3:3). The certain hope of the Lord's return motivates the believer to live godly in an ungodly world. That hope becomes a transforming reality in this life, bringing us joy and cheering us through the trials of this world.

Our hope will cause us to share our faith in Christ with a lost and dying world. We have a hope and joy to share that others should see in our lives. 1 Peter 3:15 exhorts us, "Be ready to give a defense to everyone who asks you a reason for the hope that is in you." So I challenge you today to take this gift of hope that God gives and live your life to the fullness in him. Be joyous and courageous in all that you do.

Week 4: Abigail Intervenes (1 Samuel 25: 1-35)


Bottom Line: You can show you care about others by being part of the solution.


