### A Message from Andrew Spires

#### LEAD PASTOR

I am writing this article to you having just returned from the South American country of Ecuador. First, a little background about the missionaries, Garv and Dena Pate and Pate Ministries. The Pates weren't called to the mission field until later in life. They were just regular members of North Jacksonville Baptist Church of Jacksonville, Florida. They were bluecollar, working-class folks. Though Gary never graduated high school he was a hard worker who started and owned his own small business alongside his wife Dena, who is a nurse, they also had a couple of children. They had a comfortable life, and a nice family, and were financially secure when God gave them a passion for missions. They answered that call by going on numerous short-term mission trips around the world. They were faithful to attend church and were a part of a small group they loved. However, God called them to something more. With the guidance of his pastor, Dr. Harold Reavis Jr., the Pates sold what they owned and decided to move to Ecuador to become full-time missionaries. They spoke little Spanish, but that didn't dissuade them, they enrolled in language school, followed the Lord's lead, and moved out of their comfort zone, literally leaving America for Ecuador. North Jacksonville became their sending church and by God's grace, they have been faithfully serving the Lord in Ecuador for more

than a decade. They are not spring chickens, they have adult children and grandkids, but they make great tag-team missionaries, even though they are Florida Gator fans.

Fast forward to how our paths crossed. Many of you know that near the end of 2023 myself and a couple of our church members took a trip to Togo, West Africa to explore a potential mission partnership. There we met Dr. Reavis' son, Jonathan, who is also a pastor at Schindler Road Baptist Church in the Jacksonville area. He told me of a hard-working, high-energy, bluecollar guy named Gary Pate who I just had to meet. I initially thought little about it. However, it turned out that Jonathan and I had another connection through Snowbird in North Carolina. Jonathan, like myself, had been a student pastor for many years before becoming a lead pastor, and had taken his students to Snowbird for various camps and retreats. In fact, Jonathan now serves on Snowbird's board of directors. I thought it strange that God took me to a country on another continent to meet a brother in Christ and fellow pastor that I could've met at Snowbird many times. Still, I didn't give Gary or Pate Ministries much thought. When I returned from Togo, the first day I was back in the office, I looked down at my phone and there was a text from Gary Pate. Apparently, Jonathan had told Gary that he just had to meet this guy from Georgia who pastored a church named

Lakewood in Alabama even though he was a Dawg fan. Late last year, Gary and Dena were planning a return trip to the States and were going to be in Dothan at another church and asked if we could meet. They drove up from Dothan and we went to lunch at Mike & Ed's. We talked about missions and the work they did in Ecuador to advance the kingdom. We ended our time with Gary asking me to come and see what God was doing there in Ecuador.

So, last week I had the chance to travel with around fifteen others to Ecuador. It was hot and muggy, though it was technically the beginning of Fall there. We went out daily to do ministry. We made school backpacks with supplies for kids who were about to return to school. We organized donations and supplies for the ministry. Daily we traveled into communities and villages to perform "bible clubs" where children and adults would come for worship and to hear the Word of God. We had church on Sunday in a cinder block building with no air conditioning. We had a movie night in the same building on Tuesday night where 300 people just walked up to see a movie and hear the Gospel. We gave away bread, coffee, hot chocolate, juice, and cookies, meeting the physical needs of the people. We showed the children the love of Christ as we played with them and made crafts, and we had Gospel conversations with the adults.

None of the buildings we used were traditional church buildings. The buildings were ones built by the missionary, some were community buildings, and in one instance even an outdoor open air pavilion was utilized, but there the Gospel was preached. Like most of Latin America, the nicest building in town is the Catholic church which is usually quite ornate compared to its surroundings. Many of these people "grew up Catholic" but were only so by tradition and not by practice. Many don't own a bible or know how to pray. Many didn't know that you and I can have a personal relationship with Jesus as our Savior and Lord. Most were just scraping by, day by day, existing on less than \$500 a month per household, and not knowing the grace God offers them. There's great opportunity for the Gospel to spread in Ecuador as in other countries we currently serve. My prayer is that all of us will answer the missional call, just as the Pates did. Maybe you won't be called to be a full-time missionary, but all our people can be a part of a shortterm team. All of our people can serve here locally and within this country for the sake of the Gospel. Just answer the call. Listen to His voice. See the desperate need all around us. And leave the results up to God. After all, someone's eternity is at stake.

### A Message from Israel Jane


#### **INTERIM STUDENT & YOUNG ADULT PASTOR**

## A Message from David Stephens

### CHILDREN'S PASTOR

What's the saying "April showers bring May flowers." So, the season is changing and I pray that we are together changing to be more and more like Jesus. What is it about seasons that change us? I'm not talking about seasons on the calendar, but life seasons. I'm writing this during the Christian Holy week. As I reflect on what actually happened to Jesus during this week, I am in AWE of how much this man suffered on my behalf. There are all kinds of churchy phrases out there that capture this week, and they are great. I use them. But, for me and my home, I try to keep it simple. Maybe it's because I work with children. The simple set of words that I'm reflecting on during this Holy week is this. "Calvary is enough". It is enough for ALL things that will ever come against you or me. It is enough to be able to endure whatever trial I must face. It is enough on the mountain top. It is enough in the valley. As I reflect on what Calvary represents for the Christ follower, I am overwhelmed with gratitude. The blood that flowed on Calvary covers ALL sin. I've recently celebrated 20 years of marriage. My wife has put up with my mess for a very long time, and she'll tell you I'm a mess, for sure! But, we'll be a mess together for as long as we have breath on this earth because, Calvary is enough. The sacrificial love that is lived out by Jesus for you and me on Calvary must be our foundation. We are nothing and He is everything, and you know what's so awesome? He wants to be our everything. We just have to let Him. We have to let him be our everything in everything. Keep it simple. Is Calvary enough in everything for you? Do you lay everything at the foot of the cross daily? Why do we take it upon ourselves and try to control with our own power? There is a part of me that would take the CSF leak that is in my wife's head out and place it into my head to ease her suffering. I would do it in a heartbeat, but I can't. All I can do is love her in my imperfection as Jesus exampled for us because Calvary is enough. There is a part of me that has always wondered why there is seemingly less and less structured church emphasis on Good Friday. You can't have a Resurrection Sunday without Calvary. In my experience across all dynamics of life, personally lived or observed. Growth happens as a result of suffering. I'm not saying that you don't grow if you're not suffering, all those truly seeking after the Father will grow. I'm saying all people who I've observed who do incredible works for the kingdom have experienced and endured suffering. Something that is important to understand about suffering is that it's not about you. It must ALWAYS be about HIM.

If Calvary is enough, and it is, Jesus is in your suffering. When we are truly able to see, feel, and witness the Glory of God in the middle of the suffering, that's a story to tell. The most remarkable people I've been privileged to know are those who have endured suffering and tell the story. We don't tell stories like we used to. We need to get back to being able to tell stories, because people are moved to understand that Calvary is enough by hearing our story. When our stories are wrapped around our gratitude for what happened at Calvary, people with ears to hear will hear and respond. If there is anything that I can impress on you during this season, be able to tell your story about suffering with humility and grace. These stories being told across kitchen tables; coffee shop counters; break room vending machines encounters; or wherever you find yourself will bring people into our fellowship like nothing else.
