

As I continued to pray and ponder the great promises of Scripture, God reminded me of one of the greatest promises in the last book of the bible.

Revelation 21 foretells the coming of the New Jerusalem where God will take up permanent residence with His children. However, there's more detail that is equally exciting, especially for those who are suffering in mind or body right now. 

Hey everyone!




