

## A Message from M.R. Hamilton

With each New Year we have the opportunity to both look back at how far we have come and to look ahead at where we hope to be this time next year. So, as I look back I find it hard to believe just how far we have come in such a short time. The new Family Activity Center feels like it has always been there and now all that remains of that project is cleaning up the last of the construction loan which is well underway. This year alone we were able to pay more than \$60,0000.00 towards that debt. This past year saw records in nearly every department of our church with VBS and the children's ministry breaking records on a weekly basis. We have seen the establishment of much needed classes in the Bible Fellowship and just this past week we saw a record number of 270 in attendance. Certainly, the New year will see us reach 300 as we have the wheels in motion to establish one more young married class. Another wonderful reality of the past year was our ability to start a new children's church for the contemporary worship time at 9 am that has helped that service grow to record numbers as well. As we look ahead we can see that service reaching numbers equal to the second service as we strive to use our limited space as many times as possible to reach more people. This past year we saw the Operation Christmas Child workers pack and load more than 10,000 shoeboxes through Lakewood alone. That is the first time we have broken 10,000 and yet it came and went almost unnoticed among all the other firsts. As you walk about the buildings you can't help but notice how bright it seems as we have already replaced over 400 of our florescent lights with LED lighting and we will continue until all the lights are replaced. It is such a blessing to have Beau Reimink now serving full time as our building and grounds superintendent. With his organization and incredible work ethic things are really getting done. Over 6000 sq. feet of new ceilings and over 6000 sq. feet of flooring have already been installed and the replacement of the lower floor windows of the CDC building are ready to start. Work crews are on site manned mostly by volunteers working almost every day to improve the facilities. Paint crews and flooring and window crews are working alongside the cleanup crews as we strive to see the building improvements continue this next year. This month also marked the completion of a long term goal as we replaced the last two original furnace units meaning that all 42 heating units on sight are now updated and 41 of the 42 A/C units have been replaced. Only one 12 ton unit remains from the originals so one more major investment there and we will have accomplished that dream.

As I look ahead I can't help but ask myself what's next? With our visitor numbers at an all-time high, growth in every area of the church will certainly continue this year and I ask that you bear with us as we continue to experience the only good pain in the ministry, growing pains. We are striving to find solutions for classes needing more space already and the problem will only get worse as we continue to grow. But rest assured we are not caught off guard and we are well aware of the challenges and are planning and working every single day to find solutions. Without more buildings we are looking at every way possible to use our facilities more efficiently and more often to accommodate the needs. I tell you as I look ahead I feel like I am climbing a mountain and just as you do then we now need to stop looking at how far we have to go and just turn around and take a look at how far we have come. Now with that new perspective of just what we have done we can rest assured that what is ahead of us is possible. Working together for the sole purpose of Kingdom growth we will make a way to get this all done. I don't know about you but I am really excited for this time next year to get here so we can see how we did it!

# A Message from Dr. Jerry Horner

We're facing a brand new year, and we don't know what that year is going to bring. However, the Bible provides us with a clear object lesson from the history of Israel that teaches us what to do as we enter a new year. In Joshua 3:1-5, Joshua gives God's people instructions concerning how they are to cross the Jordan and enter the Promised Land. It's a very simple plan. All they had to do was to wait until they saw the Levites pick up the Ark of the Covenant and start walking with it. Then they were to follow the Ark, making certain that they kept a space of about 2,000 cubits between them and the Ark. That's slightly more than the length of four and a half football fields, and the reason for that distance was that the Ark must be far enough ahead so all the hundreds of thousands of people could have a clear view of it at all times. Joshua explained, "You have not passed this way before," so they must keep their eyes on the Ark in order to follow the way that God planned.

That Old Testament Ark was a picture of the Lord Jesus Christ, our Ark of the New Covenant. Just as the Hebrews were about to enter a land they had never seen, we are entering a place where we have never been. The year 2019 is unexplored territory, and not a one of us has lived it before. Therefore, not a one of us knows what a day may bring. But we really don't need to know what's going to happen, or where we are going, or how we'll get there. All we need to do is to keep our eyes on the Ark and follow Him. Keeping our eyes on Jesus simply means that we trust Him and depend upon Him. We count on His ability, not our inability. Nothing was to obscure the Hebrews' vision of the Ark, and nothing is to come between us and Christ.

Not a single Israelite was exempt from crossing through the flooded Jordan. There was no bridge over the water, so each one had to pass through the flood. Can you imagine their trepidation as they hurried across, looking up at the towering mountain of water poised above them? But as long as they followed the Ark, they were safe. Jesus never promised us that He is a bridge over troubled waters, but He is a path through them. So right in the middle of your Jordan, with whatever threatening floods this year may bring, you'll find the Ark. I assure you that the waters will never crash down upon the Ark, and as long as you are following Him, you are safe. God will guide you through the uncharted days of 2019, but more than that, "the Lord will do wonders among you" (Josh. 3:5). God has designed a pathway for you to walk through every day of this new year, and if you keep your eyes on Him and follow the Ark, He will guard you by His almighty power and take you safely to your appointed destination.
