

I just returned from such a place, as we were in Eagle Idaho this past week with the builders for Christ. When we traveled up in the mountains to a nearby lake it was still a little cool and they proclaimed that this was the place to be in July as the weather was perfect. They didn't say a thing about January for obvious reasons. So we envy them in July and they long to visit us in January and that must be the way God wants it to be.

Creation is a window into the divine nature and invisible qualities of their creator (Romans 1:20) so the extremes of our seasons were created to teach us something about God that He wants us all to understand. With this reality in mind I began to consider all the benefits that come from getting through a difficult season. Things like nothing makes you appreciate feeling good faster than being sick. That was the saltiest biscuits and gravy I have ever tasted but I ate it without so much as a word. Dean had been outside caring for the dogs and missed the salt shaker prank so he took his first bite totally unprepared and before he could catch himself he proclaimed "this is the saltiest gravy I have ever tasted". Before we could take a breath to catch him complaining he regrouped and added "and that is exactly how I like it". I was so impressed by his recovery that I have used that same escape every time I find myself wanting to complain. It is July, and one or more of our 52 air conditioning units will be down every Sunday from now until October and that is just the way I like it. A Message from Dr. Jerry Horner

As we celebrate our independence as a nation, let's pause to reflect on our spiritual heritage and pray for a sweeping revival across our land. The prevailing rhetoric in America today is that all religion is essentially the same and it doesn't make any difference what you believe, as long as you believe. I just watched the video of a sermon preached by the pastor of a Baptist church of 10,000 members in New York, in which he declared that it doesn't matter if you believe in Jesus or not, as long as you believe in God and follow the way of love. In effect, he proclaimed salvation to anyone who recognizes a higher power. He even had the audacity to say that he was in agreement with what Jesus taught. I don't know what version of the Bible he has been reading, but it's not the same as mine. In addition to saying that Jesus is the only way, my Bible speaks of false prophets.

Let me list four results that have issued from America's departure from its Christian foundations. First, we have gone from authority to relativism. There is no fixed standard of right and wrong, a situation described of Israel in Judges 17:6. You develop your own sense of what is right and what is wrong. You're smarter than God, so pick and choose your morals like you're in a cafeteria line.

Next, we have gone from truth to pragmatism. We no longer ask, "Is it right and true?" We simply ask, "Does it work?" People are looking for religion to serve them, man-centered rather than God-centered.

In the third place, we have gone from reason to feeling. American society has replaced biblical theology with psychology. In this atmosphere of feeling good about yourself, sin is no longer the enemy; it's guilt. We live in a no-fault society in which sin is a forgotten word. Nobody is sinful; there is only sickness. Nobody is wicked; there is only weakness. Nobody is a thief; there are only victims of economic disadvantage. It reminds me of people falling off a cliff and we bring in ambulances at the bottom of the cliff. Wouldn't it be better to build fences at the top of the cliff?

Finally, we have gone from convictions to opinions. Instead of "the Bible says," it's "I feel this way." It's sad that not only individuals and churches have compromised, but denominations as a whole are allowing public opinion to determine their theology and ethics, rather than the dogmatic pronouncements of God in His written word.

The consequence of what I have described is moral confusion. Our children in college are being taught that you can't be certain about anything. In one class recently, after the professor declared that we can know nothing for certain, a student asked, "Professor, are you sure about that?" The instructor said, "I'm absolutely certain." Think about that one.

But there is hope for America, and we are already seeing the beginning of God's deliverance. In Judges 2:16 we read that God sent judges to deliver Israel, in spite of their rebellion. God had rather save than forgive. George Washington took the oath of office with his hand on the Bible, and then he leaned down and kissed its pages. In his following inaugural address, he said, "It would be peculiarly improper to omit in this first official Act, my fervent supplications to that Almighty Being who rules over the Universe, who presides in the Councils of Nations, and whose providential aids can supply every human defect, that his benediction may consecrate to the liberties and happiness of the People of the United States. . . . No People can be bound to acknowledge and adore the invisible hand, which conducts the Affairs of men more than the People of the United States. Every step, by which they have advanced to the character of an independent nation, seems to have been distinguished by some token of providential agency."

As his first official act, Washington took the entire congress, every representative and every senator, to church for a two-hour worship service. May God bring revival to America!


We need KIDZ on Wednesday nights.
