As we observe the birth of our nation, we cannot fail to realize that the walls that made America great are crumbling, taking our country apart a stone at a time, and we are in grave danger. I'm not an alarmist, but I grieve for our nation because of its downward trend. We are reaping the harvest of forgetting God, and His wrath is in the imminent foreground for this country unless we repent and get right with God. Over the past years we have surrendered our foundational principles progressively day by day, a step at a time, stepping backward toward anarchy and socialism. We are witnessing the collapse of morals, skyrocketing inflation, the spread of anarchy, the glorification of perversion, the callous murder of millions of babies, and blatant political corruption. We have almost reached the bottom of the garbage can, where there are no absolutes, where the public decides what is right and wrong, and tolerance is the order of the day. Those who are intent on taking over this nation hide behind social issues and seek to blackmail us with shame and guilt over our intolerance of evil.

"If the foundations are destroyed, what can the righteous do?" (Psalm 11:3). There is much we can do, and I stand on God's word when I declare that this downward trend can be changed. First, however, we need a generation of spiritual and political leaders who have the courage to stand in the gap and proclaim, "Thus says the Lord" (Jer. 29:4), and who will fearlessly expose the problem, instead of quibbling, making excuses, and placing the blame everywhere but the real source. Nehemiah faced a situation that parallels ours, and he mourned and prayed (Neh. 1:4). When we pray as he prayed, we will see the same restoration that he experienced. How did he pray?

It was a prayer of contrition. He wept, mourned, fasted, and prayed (Neh. 1:4). The church has forgotten how to weep, fast, pray, and seek the face of God with such intensity. There is no way that America will come back to God until those who profess to know Him begin to pray a prayer of brokenness. "If My people who are called by My name will humble themselves, and pray and seek My face, and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin and heal their land" (2 Chron. 7:14).

It was a prayer of confession. Nehemiah confessed his own sins and those of the nation (Neh. 1:6). We must nationally repent, but it accomplishes nothing unless we individually repent. It's not enough to cry and mourn over the condition unless you are willing to repent. Without personal repentance, you'll never be a part of the solution, but a part of the problem.

It was a prayer of confidence. Nehemiah reminded God of His promises, and boldly said, "I'm holding You to Your word" (Neh. 1:8-10). That's what real prayer is. It's not just thinking up things that you want and then going to heaven with a shopping list. Real prayer is rooted in the firm promises of God's word, finding a promise in the Bible and standing on it. God says, "Concerning the work of my hands, you command me" (Isa. 45:11). Prayer is not overcoming God's reluctance to do something; it's laying hold of His willingness to do it.

It was a prayer of commitment (Neh. 1:11). Nehemiah was the personal valet of the king of Persia, and he lived in luxury, far above the poverty and degradation of his own nation. But he was so burdened over the condition of his nation that he couldn't stay in his place of security. So he prayed, "Lord, prosper me in what I'm about to do, because I'm leaving this warm nest and committing myself to my nation." It's not enough to pray the prayer of contrition, confession, and confidence unless you are also willing to pray the prayer of commitment. It will take all of God's people to change the course of this nation. We don't have equal talents and abilities, but we can have equal commitment and equal sacrifice.

Someone once asked the comedian Flip Wilson what his religion was. He replied that he was a Jehovah's Bystander. When asked what that meant, Flip explained that they wanted him to be a Jehovah's Witness, but he didn't want to get involved. That may describe a lot of us. We bemoan the deplorable state of our country, but we don't commit ourselves to do anything about it.







A Message from Andrew Spires

We all face defining moments in life. Some decisions are bold, significant decisions, like who to marry, where to live, what career path to take, and when to retire. However, many defining moments don't seem that defining in the moment. However, every decision has an outcome; good or bad. The decisions we make today can greatly affect who we will become in the future. Recently, during one of our Friday morning Breakfast Clubs, we examined the life of the Old Testament character named Lot. Lot is overshadowed in the book of Genesis by his famous uncle Abraham (Abram). Lot's story is represented as part of Abraham's story and as such it holds special meaning. Abraham becomes a father figure to Lot, and Lot is tremendously blessed because of God's covenantal blessing on Abraham. Both Abraham and Lot moved their families together, but the land could not support their flocks and soon their shepherds began to quarrel. Abraham and Lot are both facing a defining moment but it isn't clear that either of them knows it at the time.

Let's look at several ways you can show godly wisdom in the defining moments of life.

1. Godly wisdom #1: Who's under your tent? (Genesis 13:1-18)

-Ever heard the saying; "Show me your friends, and I'll show you your future?"

-Verse 9: Abraham gave Lot the first choice of the land, and Lot chose to camp near Sodom (vs. 10).

-Lot chose by appearance, not by seeking God's will. Lot chose to pitch his tent right outside some large cities.

-Verse 12; Abraham settles in the land of Canaan, which we now call the Promised Land. He chooses a solitary life away from the wickedness in the cities.

-Abraham was right where God wanted him to be, but Lot was not.

-Verse 13; "Now the men of Sodom were wicked and were sinning greatly against the Lord." Lot chose to surround himself with sinners." Lot's simple choice would greatly affect his future and have serious repercussions for his whole family.

-At first, Lot lived just outside the city, but before long, he will move inside its walls. Once you start moving towards sin, you will eventually become entangled. You cannot hang around sinful people and think your actions will not be affected.

2. Godly wisdom #2: Hear God's warnings. (Genesis 19:1-29)

-God sends three visitors to Abraham with a warning, one of whom is the pre-incarnate Christ.

-The visitors inform Abraham that God will judge Sodom and Gomorrah for their sinfulness they will be wiped off the map.

-Verse 20; "The outcry against Sodom and Gomorrah is so great and their sin so grievous." Sin left unchecked demands God's judgment. We will always reap what we sow!

-This passage portrays the rampant immorality, sexual perversion, and violence of the people in these towns. We all have temptations, and we all sin, but when God convicts us and calls us to repentance we must listen and obey.

-Simple truth; the more you sin, the easier it becomes to sin. Failure begets more failure. Stop dipping your finger into the water of sin to see if it's still hot!

-Verse 26; "But Lot's wife looked back, and she became a pillar of salt." Do not look back at what you've left behind (worldliness), but fix your eyes on Jesus.

3. Godly wisdom #3: You will be rescued. (2 Peter 2:6-9)

-God always provides a way out! You might be tempted to think less of God for destroying two cities? Yet, from another point of view, God sent an angelic rescue party for His people.

-Lot made a poor decision about where to live, and who he surrounded himself with. That one decision soon cost him his home and his wife. Later in his story, the consequences will extend to the rest of this family.

-1 Cor. 10:13; "No temptation has overtaken you except what is common to mankind. And God is faithful; He will not let you be tempted beyond what you can bear. But when you are tempted, He will also provide a way out so that you can endure it."

-Verse 7; "and if He rescued Lot, a righteous man..." On the outside looking in, Lot in no way seems like a righteous man? Yet, when judgment comes and God calls him out of that city, Lot responded in faith. Just like Abraham and us, Lot is counted righteous by his faith.

-Verse 8; says there was a war going on inside Lot. He was tormented by the sinfulness all around him. Though Lot was distressed, something kept him in Sodom?

-Are you disturbed by what you see happening in this world? Or do you feel right at home?

-Verse 9; God knows how and when to rescue His righteous people.

Application: First, watch who you surround yourselves with. Your friends are powerful influences and will either lead you towards Christ or away from Christ. Second, heed God's warnings! When God gives direction or convicts you and calls you to repentance do not ignore the voice of the Lord. Finally, remember when you are tempted it doesn't have to lead to sin. Fight! Battle! Obey! Wait patiently on the Lord. His rescue party is on the way! God bless.
