

A Message from Dr. Jerry Horner

I'm writing this article in Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam, formerly Saigon, but I will not send it until I'm out of this country. You may understand when I tell you that my host pastor here has been arrested twenty-one times and has spent time in jail, simply because he is a Christian leader. As a westerner, I cannot be seen talking to more than one or two Vietnamese on the street, lest the police stop to investigate.

Tonight I preached at a youth rally that meets every Sunday night. Everything is planned, organized, and directed by young people. They call themselves the "New Generation Church," and I was the speaker at their first meeting in 2016. It was a thrill to see how they have grown in numbers and maturity since then.

What happened in our meeting tonight, which was held in a non-descript building on a quiet street just off a major thoroughfare, was a stark contrast to the activities in a large ornate building directly across the street. In front of that building is a statue of Ho Chi Minh, and the building houses a school in which all the students, from kindergarten through high school, are selected by the government to be trained as future communist leaders. They receive the best education possible in the arts and sciences, but they are also indoctrinated in the philosophies of atheistic communism.

Physically, only a narrow street separated the two groups of young people, but spiritually they were as far apart as darkness is from light. That realization caused me to ponder the actions of our own government in the modern era that have effectively forced God out of our educational system. I would like to review with you some court decisions that led to the present situation.

Engel v. Vitale, 1962, was the first case to separate religious principles from public education. In this case, which resulted in removing prayer from schools, there was no legal precedent cited from the entire history of America. Not one! There was no reference to the constitution at all. The seven members of the Supreme Court who were responsible for this ruling had no background on court benches. They were all politicians appointed by politicians. The landmark decision of this court changed the direction of the legal system of America. It was no longer constitutional law.

Would you like to read the prayer that these justices deemed unsuitable for our school children? Here it is: "Almighty God, we acknowledge our dependence upon Thee, and beg Thy blessings upon us, our parents, our teachers, and our country." Isn't it ironic that while this prayer acknowledges God only once, the Declaration of Independence acknowledges Him four times, and our Constitution is dated "in the year of our Lord"?

Abington v. Schempp, 1963, was the case that resulted in the prohibition of Bible reading in our schools. Without any constitutional basis, the court declared that Bible reading in the school could be "psychologically harmful." In its 5-4 decision of Stone v. Graham in 1980, the Supreme Court removed the Ten Commandments from schools, even though the justices agreed that the Ten Commandments were a "passive" display, meaning that people would have to stop on their own will to read them. I suppose those justices had never read what James Madison, the chief architect of our constitution, said: "We have staked the whole future of American civilization not upon the power of government, far from it. We have staked the future of all of our political institutions upon the capacity of each and all of us to govern ourselves, to control ourselves, to sustain ourselves according to the Ten Commandments."

As I think of the future of Vietnam under the leadership of people like those children whose minds and hearts are being hardened against God, I cannot help thinking of our own country in light of this quote from Thomas Jefferson, inscribed on his memorial in Washington: "Can the liberties of a nation be secure when we have removed a conviction that these liberties are the gift of God? Indeed I tremble for my country when I reflect that God is just, that His justice cannot sleep forever."


We have begun our summer missions season, as I write this article we've completed our first day of service in North Carolina. Today, we began building a disability ramp for a senior adult with physical problems and also began scraping and painting her home. Although the weather was poor and very wet, our students, young adults, and chaperones slogged through the mud and rain and served valiantly without complaining. I love missions because it forces our students and young adults out of their normal schedules, out of their homes (out of their rooms), and puts them on display for Christ in ways they never imagined in places they've never been. Even worse there are people all around us who don't know Jesus Christ, and we don't often think much about them. As adults, it's easy to get so busy in our lives, that we forget each one of us is called and commanded to represent Christ as His ambassadors. I truly believe we are all walking past numerous people who we could impact for the sake of the Gospel, but somehow in our busyness, and in our complacency we just pass them by. While this summer mission season has just begun, and we cannot yet imagine all the things God will do and accomplish in and through us, let us all renew our commitment to serve others in our daily lives. My prayer and challenge is this; that we will all be stretched into uncomfortable circumstances for the cause of Christ and be led by the Holy Spirit by divine appointment to those God intends for us to speak His truth in love. Make yourselves available to God, and He WILL use you! As we serve, we thank you all for your prayers and support! God bless.


