A Message from Dr. Jerry Horner



MINISTER OF DISCIPLESHIP & OUTREACH

Over the past several weeks, all of us have been experiencing a universal problem, but have you ever gone through some difficulty in which you feel like you are the only one who has experienced it? Perhaps it's bereavement, sickness, a financial challenge, an estranged relationship, or a severe disappointment, but whatever the problem is, you feel all alone in facing it. 1 Corinthians 10:13 tells us, "No temptation has overtaken you except such as is common to man...." The word translated "common" means "not unprecedented to humans." However peculiar you may think your trial is, no matter how overwhelming, suffocating, and insurmountable your trap might seem, it's really a common human problem that has already been faced and overcome by countless believers in the past.

All of us can identify with the plea of Psalm 130:1--"Out of the depths I have cried to you, O Lord." We all have been in the depths. The Hebrew describes someone caught in a deep and dangerous abyss. The Psalmist doesn't identify what his specific problem was—he simply used the nonspecific "depths." If he had told us what his situation was, we would limit the words to that particular problem. But as it is, the word "depths" applies to every oppressive situation, and whatever our "depths" may be, this Psalm tells us what to do when we're going down for the third time.

First, we are to cry out to the Lord. Literally, the Psalmist says that he has cried and is still crying. He was still in the midst of his trial when he wrote these words, and there is an urgency involved. He isn't writing about a past experience or discussing a theological theory. He had an urgent need right now. Sometimes God allows us to experience the depths in order that we might learn of His grace and forgiveness. When we cry out to the Lord we take our mind off the depths and focus on the Rock that is higher than I, and according to verses 3 and 4 we discover what kind of God we're dealing with.

Then verses 5 and 6 tell us to wait for the Lord. The idea is to wait for the Lord to act, and the Psalmist illustrates the waiting with a picture of those who wait for the morning. Anyone who waits for the sunrise should remember two important truths. The first is that you cannot rush the sunrise, as much as you would like to. Daylight Saving Time doesn't fool the sun. It's going to rise according to its own timetable. It's the same with the Lord. You cannot rush Him. With God, timing is more important than time, and God's timing is always perfect.

The second thing to remember is that the sun does rise. When you wait for the morning, you don't wait in vain, because the morning always comes. And when you wait for the Lord, you don't wait in vain. He will come; He will act; He will deliver. Time spent waiting for the Lord is never time wasted.

According to verse 7, the third thing we are to do is to hope in the Lord. "O Israel hope in the Lord." The word "hope" today usually means wishful thinking or a desire, without any assurance that it will happen. In other words, "I hope so." But the biblical idea of hope is far different. It's a solid certainty that is based on the promises of God. We confidently believe that God will keep His word, and we really can't wait for the Lord if we don't have confidence in Him. To the Psalmist, this confidence is based on two things. First, there is God's goodness. Verse 7 tells us, "For with the Lord there is mercy," or steadfast love. Second, there is God's greatness. "And with Him is abundant redemption." The Contemporary English Version reads, "He has the power to save you." The New Revised Standard has, "With Him is great power to redeem," while the New English Bible translates, "Great is His power to set men free." The Psalmist is telling us that as sure as the morning comes, God and God alone will save His people.

If you feel like you're drowning in trouble, about to go down for the third time, why not follow the Psalmist's suggestions? God knows exactly how to bring you out of the depths.
