Shaping the Future

Youth & Younger Single Adults

I would like to share with you some of the challenges that were given by our speaker Dr. Steve Stewart at Genesis Weekend in September. We had four group sessions (I Friday, 2 Saturday, and I Sunday morning) that gave our students practical ways to share their faith with their friends. On Friday night we came to understand that all Christians are called to be witnesses (Acts 1:8), it is not reserved for a special highly trained or "called" few, anyone can do it. To effectively share our faith a witness must share what they know, just as a witness is called to testify in a courtroom, so should a Christian be able to deliver the gospel message. We found out it is not enough just to mention God's name in our conversations, but intentionally relate what God has done in our lives. Finally we see that we never fail at witnessing unless we fail to witness at all, if we share our faith and the other person rejects Christ we are to pray for them and ask the Holy Spirit to break through in their lives. Saturday morning, we studied Mark 2:1-13, the story of the men who brought their paralyzed friend to Jesus and lowered him through the roof due to the crowd. We noticed several things about this story, we saw the friends concern for the paralytic man, we see their compassion, and we see their conviction to act and get him to Jesus. Also, we notice the amazing conversion as Jesus heals the man and also forgives him of his sin. Others there had criticism towards Jesus for telling a man his sins were forgiven, so Jesus also healed him to show his authority over everything. Finally we watch the conclusion, as the man rises up and walks out "in full view of all of them". There were four types of people there that day; the crippled, the carless, the criticizers, and the compassionate. We can't be crippled by fear when sharing our faith, we can't be careless that others are lost and dying without Jesus, we can't heed the criticizers who say we're too extreme in our faith, and we must show our changed lives by our compassion for the lost. Saturday afternoon we read Paul's impassioned speech/testimony before the king in Acts 26, where he boldly attempts to lead the king and all who listen to Jesus. We have to share our story, people will relate to your testimony. We learned three steps when giving our testimony; first share my life before Christ, next how I met Christ, and thirdly share my life since I met Christ and the new creation I've become. We found 7 S's that helpful for us to remember when witnessing; be sure, be simple, be specific, be short, be sincere, be scriptural, and be sensitive. Finally, Sunday morning we ended in the book of Philemon with Paul's love for a slave and recent convert named Onesimus. Onesimus had been a slave, owned by Philemon, and had run away from his master. Not only had he fled, but he also stole from Philemon before he left so that he could survive on his own. Philemon was a believer, a supporter of Paul's ministry, and a wealthy man, who even hosted a church in his home, but God would ask more of him. We don't know the exact circumstances of how Paul and Onesimus meet, but we know that Paul loves him as a son and sends him back to his master Philemon, no longer as a slave, but to be "useful" as a fellow brother in Christ. He asks Philemon not to punish him as was deserved but to accept as if it were Paul coming to him. Paul didn't see a slave when he saw Onesimus, he saw an opportunity to share his faith. We need to learn to see others as God sees them, and consider just as worthy of Christ's sacrifice as we are. After all, if we are selfish with our faith (keeping the truth to ourselves) aren't we really saying we don't care what happens to others by our actions? God sees us all as useful to the cause of Christ, no matter what our background, no matter what our social status or financial ability, God loves us equally and calls us all to be a witness for Him. My hope is that this encourages you to step out of your comfort zone, be bold, and tell others about the gospel story and what Jesus has done in your life!


