

Our country has witnessed so many acts of violence over the past few weeks that many other countries have warned their citizens against traveling to the USA. In trying to explain why evil is rampant in this country, people are pointing fingers at the president's supposedly inflammatory rhetoric, weak laws governing the possession of weapons, bad environment, poverty, and a host of other reasons—everything but sin.

In these days we seem to tolerate everything and oppose controlling what once was called evil behavior. What once was deemed unthinkable evil is not only tolerated now, but considered good and normal. Those who question such behavior and the tolerance of it are often labeled with words that end in "-phobe," such as "homophope." Societal norms, once determined by biblical principles, have been undermined to the extent that normal is what individuals think is okay for them to do, and absolute truth has given way to whatever individuals want to believe.

I am of the opinion that God gave America in 2016 an opportunity to reverse the country's gravitation toward moral and spiritual disaster, but there is a concentrated satanic opposition to fulfilling that opportunity, and it's so powerful and deceptive that many professing Christians are caught up in it. The early leaders of America would be horrified to witness how the country they founded with such high ideals is gradually being transformed into a secularist and atheistic utopia, where communist ideals are glorified and promoted, while Judeo-Christian values and morality are ridiculed and increasingly eradicated from the public and social consciousness of our nation. The decades-long assault and militant radicalism of many so-called "liberal" and "progressive" elites has resulted in the progressive deletion of God from our public and educational institutions, to be replaced with all kinds of delusion, perversion, corruption, violence, decadence, and insanity. In places of influence today are some of the most radial and hypocritical, least democratic, and characterless individuals our society has ever produced. Godlessness is always the first step towards tyranny and oppression.

Abraham Lincoln's proclamation for a day of fasting and prayer, issued on March 30, 1863, should be required reading for every citizen of the United States. He declared the nation's duty to depend upon God and called for national repentance, recognizing "that those nations only are blessed whose God is the Lord." Then he wrote these words: "And, insomuch as we know that, by His divine law, nations like individuals are subjected to punishments and chastisements in this world, may we not justly fear that the awful calamity of civil war, which now desolates the land, may be but a punishment, inflicted upon us, for our presumptuous sins, to the needful end of our national reformation as a whole People? We have been the recipients of the choicest bounties of Heaven. We have been preserved, these many years, in peace and prosperity. We have grown in numbers, wealth, and power, as no other nation has ever grown. But we have forgotten God. We have forgotten the gracious hand which preserved us in peace, and multiplied and enriched and strengthened us; and we have vainly imagined, in the deceitfulness of our hearts, that all these blessings were produced by some superior wisdom and virtue of our own. Intoxicated with unbroken success, we have become too self-sufficient to feel the necessity of redeeming and preserving grace, too proud to pray to the God that made us! It behooves us then, to humble ourselves, to confess our national sins, and to pray for clemency and forgiveness."

Aleksandr Solzhenitsyn, in a speech describing how communism dominated Russia, said: "While I was still a child, I recall hearing a number of older people offer the following explanation for the great disasters that had befallen Russia: Men have forgotten God; that's why all this has happened." He went on to tell how he devoted fifty years to an intensive study of the cause of the ruinous movement that exterminated sixty million of his people. After all those years of investigation, here was his conclusion: "I could not put it more accurately than to repeat: Men have forgotten God; that's why all this has happened."

Valley Interfaith Promise consists of 10 local host churches volunteering at 8 sites. There are two partnerships which means that 2 smaller Churches partner with another to provide hosts for meals and overnight stays. Year to date VIP has "housed" six families which means that these families are now working and they are paying affordable rent. We are fortunate that our families and our program are able to qualify for Rapid Rehousing. These programs offer help in many different ways. Some offer assistance with security deposits, first months rent, utility deposits, and some offer continued assistance up to a year! Most importantly it is continued Case Management to ensure that once our families leave us they have the necessary tools to remain stable. In addition to housing, all of our families were able to receive the necessary furnishings and extras to make their house a home. Not having to worry about those things gives them the opportunity to continue their savings. One more piece of great news. One of our families received a clear titled mini-van. Thank you all for what you do. This could not happen without you!
