Life is hard. Anyone who tells you otherwise is trying to sell you something. We all know that our lives can be difficult and challenging. On the other hand, it's an amazing time in which we live, filled with blessings. Never before have so many human beings, especially Americans, had such access to abundant food and clean water combined with healthcare that is healing illnesses and extending their lives. We may have the occasional trial, the proverbial bump in the road, but most of the time those situations pass quickly. That doesn't mean that they are not hard or real to endure, or that we always excel in "counting it all joy" when in times of trouble. For some reason, most people are honestly surprised when something goes wrong or is painful. We have somehow developed an expectation that life should be smooth and easy. For most Americans, as long as our world is okay, as long as our hometown is peaceful, and our family is intact, we don't think much about the rest of the world and its troubles. We can get so focused on our own bubble that we forget there's a great big world out there.

Yet, many in the world still suffer starvation, malnutrition, sickness, disease, and live in war-ravaged areas. Just look at the world, there are large-scale wars in the news such as Russia and Ukraine or Israel and Hamas/Palestinians. Both of these wars seem to drag on without end costing thousands of lives. However, there are many more that never make the news. It's estimated that right now there are at least 45 armed conflicts active in just the Middle East and Africa alone. If we take an honest look at the world, we can see most of the world's population lives without much hope or security in their daily lives. We don't know their stories just as they don't know ours, but we do seem to have a disconnect to the realities outside of the "first world". The problem of suffering

and why God allows it has always been a tough question to answer. Many atheists stated reason for not believing in an all-knowing, all-powerful God is due to the existence of evil. You've heard the question before; "How could God allow such evil to exist in the world?" Or; "If God is good and all-powerful, why doesn't He just stop all the suffering in the world?" He also sees every act of persecution for His Name's sake. Did you know that it is estimated that around 70 million Christians have been martyred for their faith in the last 2,000 years? Did you know that over half (+/- 45 million) of those were killed in the last century or so? Evil is on the rise and not the fall. Yet, our God sees it all and He cares about it all. Matthew 10:28-31 speaks of God's watchful and caring eye. "Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. Rather, be afraid of the One who

can destroy both soul and body in hell. Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? Yet not one of them will fall to the ground apart from the will of your Father. And even the very hairs of your head are all numbered. So don't be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows." In context, Jesus had sent out the Twelve Disciples and had prepared them by telling them what to expect as they went. We too can expect this world to get worse and not better. We can expect to be treated poorly as followers of Christ. As believers, we are not promised an easy life, and we are not immune from trials and heartache, but we know God sees it all, we know He is there with us. Let us take solace and find our strength in the promises of God.
