Luke Study Lesson 7- Beginning of Holy Week

Ice breaker: When was a time you were so glad to finally be "there"? (after a vacation, a move, child born or coming home, school finished, ...)

1. Page 91 **Hosanna- Please Save Us Now!! People were quoting from: Psalm 118:25-26 Save us, we pray, O Lord! O Lord, we pray, give us success! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! We bless you from the house of the Lord.

Jesus' purpose in riding into Jerusalem was to make public His claim to be their Messiah and King of Israel in fulfillment of Old Testament prophecy. Jesus rides into His capital city as a conquering King and is hailed by the people as such, in the manner of the day. He receives the worship and praise of the people because only He deserves it. No longer does He tell His disciples to be quiet about Him but to shout His praises and worship Him openly. The spreading of cloaks was an act of homage for royalty (see 2 Kings 9:13). Jesus was openly declaring to the people that He was their King and the Messiah they had been waiting for. But when He failed in their expectations, when He refused to lead them in a massive revolt against the Roman occupiers, the crowds quickly turned on Him. Within just a few days, their hosannas would change to cries of "Crucify Him!" Those who hailed Him as a hero would soon reject and abandon Him. MacArthur

But how do we **now** enter the presence of God? Adam and Eve had intimate fellowship in the presence of God before the fall. Since that time, sin has prevented our ability to be in the physical presence of God. Now only the holy, sinless angels are in the physical presence of God. But Christians have the presence of God within us by virtue of His indwelling Holy Spirit (<u>John 14:23; 15:4</u>), and that indwelling presence comes only through faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. 2. Page 94 Psalm 118 is a wonderful Psalm!! The stone that the builders rejected has now become the cornerstone ²³ This is the Lord's doing, and it is wonderful to see. ²⁴ This is the day the Lord has made. We will rejoice and be glad in it. ²⁵ Please, Lord, please save us. Please, Lord, please give us success. ²⁶ Bless the one who comes in the name of the Lord. We bless you from the house of the Lord. ²⁷ The Lord is God, shining upon us. Take the sacrifice and bind it with cords on the altar. ²⁸ You are my God, and I will praise you! You are my God, and I will exalt you! ²⁹ Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good! His faithful love endures forever.

How many Temples were there? The crowning achievement of King Solomon's reign was the erection of a magnificent temple in Jerusalem, often called Solomon's temple or the first temple. Solomon began to build the house of the LORD in Jerusalem on Mount Moriah, where the Lord had appeared to his father David (2 Chronicles 3:1). This new, stationary temple would replace the portable tabernacle constructed during the wilderness wandering. If Solomon reigned from 970 to 930 BC, then he began building the temple in 966 BC. Until the first temple was destroyed by the Babylonians some four hundred years later, in 586 BC, sacrifice was the predominant mode of divine service there. Seventy years later, a second temple was completed on the same site, and sacrifices again resumed. The book of Ezra chronicles the building of the second temple.

During the first century, Herod greatly enlarged and expanded this temple, which became known as Herod's temple. It was destroyed by the Romans in AD 70, during the siege of Jerusalem. Only a small portion of the retaining wall remains to this day, known as "The Wailing Wall." https://www.gotquestions.org/Solomon-first-temple.html

Luke had two verses to expose the scribes...but see what Matthew says Jesus said to them.

Matthew 23:10-36 "What sorrow awaits you teachers of religious law and you Pharisees. Hypocrites! For you cross land and sea to make one convert, and then you turn that person into twice the child of hell you yourselves are!¹⁶ "Blind guides! What sorrow awaits you ²⁷ Hypocrites! For you are like whitewashed tombs—beautiful on the outside but filled on the inside with dead people's bones and all sorts of impurity. ²⁸ Outwardly you look like righteous people, but inwardly your hearts are filled with hypocrisy and lawlessness. ²⁹ "What sorrow awaits you teachers of religious law and you ³³ Snakes! Sons of vipers! How will you escape the judgment of hell? Jesus did not hold back here!!

4. Page 95-96

Luke 21:5-24- Destruction of the Temple and Jerusalem

Roman occupation of Israel had been in place for over a generation, and most people living at the time of Christ would have never known a time when Israel was not occupied. Many Jews lived in the expectation that God's Messiah would soon come to deliver them from the political and cultural bondage imposed by Rome. But, when Jesus the Messiah came, He made it clear that His kingdom was "not of this world" (John 18:36). After His "Triumphal Entry" instead of ridding Jerusalem of the Romans, Jesus cleanses the temple teaches that the kingdom will be taken away from Israel and given, at least in part, to the Gentiles (verses 33—22:14); tells His followers to pay taxes to Caesar condemns the Jewish leaders and predicts that the temple will be destroyed. He was not going to be the type of Messiah that so many expected, and they rejected Him. The rejection of Christ left the door open for other would-be messiahs to try to save Israel from Rome, and in less than 40 years after Jesus ascended into heaven, an Israelite rebellion against Rome had been crushed and the temple had been destroyed...about AD 66—73 and is also known as the Great Jewish Revolt. About halfway through the conflict, the temple in Jerusalem was completely destroyed, and the Jews in Jerusalem were slaughtered. When will end times happen? Matthew 24: ³⁶ "However, no one knows the day or hour when these things will happen, not even the angels in heaven or the Son himself. Only the Father knows.

How will Jesus Return

Acts 1: After saying this, he was taken up into a cloud while they were watching, and they could no longer see him. As they strained to see him rising into heaven, two white-robed men suddenly stood among them. He was aid, why are you standing here staring into heaven? Jesus has been taken from you into heaven, but someday he will return from heaven in the same way you saw him go!

agitated about our situation, be obedient to what we know (prayer, time in the Word, being a part of the body-church-tithe, caring for each other, giving others (poor), come before the Lord and ask for forgiveness for our known and unknown sins, look at our life-style and habits and repent, who do we need to forgive and/or ask for forgiveness, what/who are we praying for, see suffering and trials as God working in our lives to sanctify us and realize that all things work together for good, love as God loves.
