Cell Group Discussion Questions

Get to Know

1. Prior to the sermon, whom did you believe was most culpable for the death of Jesus?

From the Sermon

2. Divide the passage into four parts: a) John 18:1-11, b) John 18:12-13, 19-24, c) John 18:33-19:16a, and d) John 18:15-18, 25-27 and have different people read it individually. Have each person(s) give a reason how the antagonist in their narrative contributed to the death of Jesus.
3. What do you find surprising about these four characters, especially as it relates to the death of Jesus? Think for example...
 - Judas and the Last Supper and attempt to return the money
 - Caiaphas’ earlier prophecy of the death of Jesus
 - Pilate's attempts to absolve himself of responsibility
 - Peter's denial in the context of his earlier declarations of loyalty to Jesus
4. The sermon emphasizes that while individuals like Judas, Caiaphas, Pilate, and Peter played roles in Jesus's death, ultimately, it was our lostness and God’s love that brought Jesus to the cross. Who then was ultimately culpable for the death of Jesus?
