4. Baptism | Jul 7

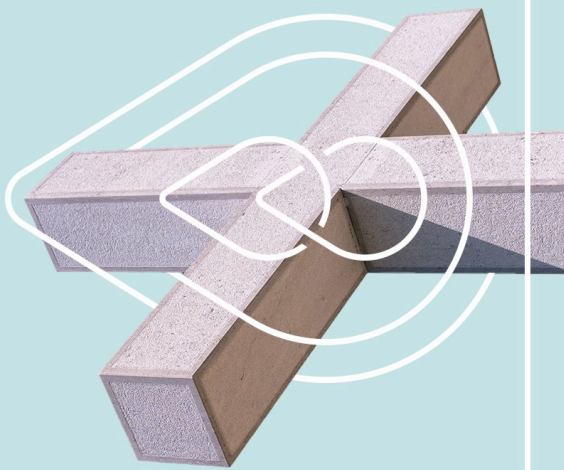

Cell Group Discussion Questions

Get to Know

1. If you grew up in the church, what was your understanding of the rapture or tribulation?

From the Sermon

2. The vision of seventy weeks in Daniel 9:24-27 is complex and often debated. What are the key takeaways from this prophecy, and how do they point to the coming of the Messiah and the end times?
3. In Daniel's prayer (Daniel 9:3-19), he confesses the sins of Israel using "we" instead of "they." What significance do you see in Daniel identifying himself with the sins of his people, and how can we apply this in our own prayer life?
4. In 9:9-15, Daniel seems to justify bringing “calamity” upon the people. Why was this a necessarily part of his prayer?
5. In Daniel 9:17-18, Daniel makes a heartfelt plea for God's mercy, not based on their righteousness but on God's great mercy. How can this perspective shape our approach to prayer, especially when seeking forgiveness and help?
