Cell Group Discussion Questions

Get to Know

1. In what ways is your faith different or same of your parents and your kids?

From the Sermon

2. How do you think the experiences of the first, second, and third generations of Hebrews influenced their relationship with God? How might these generational differences be reflected in your own family or church community?
3. Read Numbers 14:28-35. The sermon talked about the "generational trauma" between the first and second generations of Hebrews from this passage. Do you feel like that is something you had to wrestle with? How have these experiences shape how you are parenting your kids or how you will parent your future kids.
4. Read Judges 2:6-11. The third generation is described as a generation that did not know God and did what was right in their own eyes. Can you see evidence of that in your kids and grandkids' generations?
5. The last verse of the book of Judges observes in Judges 21:25, "In those days there was no king in Israel. Everyone did what was right in his own eyes." The sermon suggests that the transmission of faith often fails with the third generation. What is something that you must commit to in the life of your family to better prepare your children and grandchildren to serve the King?
