GET-TO-KNOW

 Ice Breaker – What's a memorable New Year's resolution you've made in the past, and how did it turn out?

FROM-THE-SERMON

Read Acts 9:1-9 Together.

1. Considering a Concern:

In Acts 9:1, Saul is deeply concerned about stopping the spread of Christianity. What does this reveal about how our concerns, even if sincere, can sometimes be misguided? Are there concerns in your life that God might be asking you to reassess this year?

2. Confronting a Challenge:


Saul's encounter with Jesus on the road to Damascus (Acts 9:3-9) was a crisis that forced him to stop and listen to God. Have you experienced a moment when God used a challenge or crisis to get your attention or change your direction? What did you learn from it?

3. Comprehending God's Plan:

Ananias played a pivotal role in helping Saul understand God's plan for his life (Acts 9:17-18). Who has God used in your life to help you grow spiritually or understand His purpose? How can you encourage someone else in their faith journey?

4. Committing to a Choice:

After his transformation, Saul immediately began preaching about Jesus (Acts 9:20). What can his response teach us about taking action when we sense God calling us to something new? What is



one area in your life where you feel God is calling you to take a bold step of faith?

BEYOND-THE-SERMON

1. For yourself:

Saul's journey from opposing Christ to following Him completely was dramatic. In what area of your life do you sense God calling you to make a change this year, whether big or small?

2. As a group:

As a Cell Group, how can we support each other in navigating the concerns, challenges, and changes we face while staying faithful to God's purpose?
