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## SERMON NOTES

Exodus

“The God Who Sees, Hears, and Knows”

Exodus 2:23-25 & 3:7-10

**Point #1 – In seasons of difficulty, waiting, and silence, it is natural for us to feel un\_\_\_\_\_, un\_\_\_\_\_, and un\_\_\_\_\_ by God.**

A. Israel was suffering (Ex 2:23)

B. Israel was in waiting (Ex 2:23-24 & Gen 15:13)

C. Israel was experiencing silence from God (Gen 15:13)

**Point #2 – God \_\_\_\_\_ our pain, \_\_\_\_\_ our prayers, and \_\_\_\_\_ for us.**

**A. God sees...**

Ex 3:7a - “I have surely seen the affliction of my people who are in Egypt...”

**B. God hears...**

Ex 3:7b – “...I have heard their cries because of their taskmasters.”

**C. God knows/understands/cares**

Ex 3:7c – “I know their sufferings.”

**Point #3 – “The \_\_\_\_\_ assures us that God truly sees, hears, and knows us—no matter our situation.”**

Exodus 2:24 – “And God remembered his covenant with Abraham, with Isaac, and with Jacob.”

**Big Idea: No matter what we are going through in life, we can have assurance that God does see our struggles, hears our prayers, while knowing and caring deeply for us.**

## Cell Group Discussion Questions

### Icebreaker:

As we begin a new season of cell groups, what is one hope or prayer that you have for your CG this year?

### Digging Deeper: [Read Exodus 1:7–14]

**#1 – We learned in this week’s teaching, that especially in seasons of difficulty, waiting, and silence, it is natural for us to feel un\_\_\_\_\_, un\_\_\_\_\_, and un\_\_\_\_\_ by God.**

- Can you share about a time when you felt like God was silent or distant? What emotions/thoughts surfaced as you went through that season?
- How do you typically respond when you feel unseen or unheard by God—do you withdraw, cry out more, or something else?

**#2 – We also learned that God \_\_\_\_\_ our pain, \_\_\_\_\_ our prayers, and \_\_\_\_\_ for us.**

- Read Exodus 3:7-10. Which aspect of God’s response—seeing, hearing, or knowing—feels most comforting to you right now?

**#3 – Finally, we were reminded that the \_\_\_\_\_ assures us that God truly sees, hears, and knows us—no matter our situation.”**

- How does the cross of Jesus give us confidence that God truly sees, hears, and knows us?

### Application:

Read Exodus 2:23-24 and see how many times the Scriptures mention how the Israelites “groaned” or “cried out” to God. What are some areas/things in your life that you’ve been “groaning” or “crying out” to God about?

This week, set aside time to pray honestly about one area of struggle, grief, or longing.
