
5. Prayer Chapel | Nov 4

A Vision for Home I

“Home is Where Family is”

Genesis 1:26; Ephesians 2:19

Point #1 – God _____ us for community, intimacy, and belonging

Genesis 1:26 – “Then God said, ‘Let us make man in our image, after our likeness.’”

Point #2 – Sin _____ our experience of community, intimacy, and belonging

Genesis 3:8-12 - “8 And they heard the sound of the Lord God walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the Lord God among the trees of the garden. 9 But the Lord God called to the man and said to him, “Where are you?” 10 And he said, “I heard the sound of you in the garden, and I was afraid, because I was naked, and I hid myself.” 11 He said, “Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten of the tree of which I commanded you not to eat?” 12 The man said, “The woman whom you gave to be with me, she gave me fruit of the tree, and I ate.”

Point #3 – In Christ, we have a redeemed community through the presence of a loving family – the _____

Ephesians 2:19 – “So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God...”

Big Idea: We were created for community — a community fractured by sin, yet redeemed in Christ through the Church, a loving family.

Cell Group Discussion Questions

Breaking the Ice:

What is your favorite memory from your time at Living Hope?

Digging Deeper:

Point #1 – God created us for community, intimacy, and belonging

- We see in the “imago dei” that we were created for relationships and belonging. Yet, so many people — even Christians — still feel lonely or disconnected. What do you think are some of the key barriers that keep us from experiencing the kind of deep relationships God designed us for (e.g., busyness, fear, hurt, individualism, pride)?
- How might God be inviting you to move toward deeper connection right now — either in this group or in another relationship?

Point #2 – Sin fractures our experience of community, intimacy, and belonging

- What were the three stages of the “cycle of community”? Knowing your CG, what stage of the “cycle of community” do you think you are at?
- We learned that a true Christian community often begins at the disillusionment stage — not the idealization (honeymoon) stage. Where have you experienced this in your own relationships, and what helped you move toward acceptance (redemption) instead of walking away?

Point #3 – In Christ, we have a redeemed community through the presence of a loving family — the _____

- Read Ephesians 2:19–22. What does it mean to be “members of the household of God”?
- When did the Church stop feeling like an event you attend or a building you enter once a week — and start feeling like a family you belong to? What helped that shift happen for you?

Application:

- As we end today’s discussion, let’s remember that our ability to experience church as family is a precious gift from the Father—made possible only through His Son, Jesus Christ. Before closing this week’s meeting, take a few moments to share what you’re grateful for about this community, and pray together—thanking God for the ways He has met you here.
- Please also thank your CG leader for the ways you’ve experienced belonging, care and encouragement through this group.
