

SERMON NOTES

A Vision for Home II
“A Home for the Exiles”

Luke 15:11-32

Pastor Jeff Hyun

Point #1 – “Exiles” are those who have left the Father’s house or left the Father Himself

A. Those who have let the Father’s house (or been displaced) (Nomads)

Luke 15:13 – “Not many days later, the younger son gathered all he had and **took a journey into a far country...**”

B. Those who have left the Father (Prodigals)

Luke 15:12 - “And the younger of them said to his father, **‘Father, give me the share of property that is coming to me.’** And he divided his property between them.”

Point #2 - The exiles are longing for a “home”

Luke 15:17-18 - “But when he came to himself, he said, ‘How many of my father's hired servants have more than enough bread, but I perish here with hunger! I will arise and go to my father, and I will say to him, “Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you.”’

A. A “home” in the Father’s love

B. A “home” in the Father’s house

Point #3 - To welcome home the exiles, we must reflect the heart of the Father to them

- **The Father sees...**

Luke 15:20a - “But while he was still a long way off, his father saw him...”

- **The Father welcomes...**

Luke 15:20b - “His father...ran and embraced him and kissed him.

- **The Father serves...**

Luke 15:22-23 - But the father said to his servants, ‘Bring quickly the best robe, and put it on him, and put a ring on his hand, and shoes on his feet. 23 And bring the fattened calf and kill it, and let us eat and celebrate.

Big Idea: God calls our church to be a family that welcomes home the exiles - by seeing them, welcoming them, and serving them.

Cell Group Discussion Questions

Breaking the Ice:

- What's one place that always feels like "home" to you (besides your actual house)?

Digging Deeper:

Point #1 - "Exiles" are those who have left the Father's house or left the Father Himself

- In Luke 15:13, we see the younger son gathering his belongings to leave the Father's house for a distant country. Why do you think some people today drift from the Father's house (the church) today?
- Read Luke 15:12. Why was the younger son's request for his share of the inheritance such a shockingly inappropriate thing? What does this reveal about the heart of those who may eventually end up leaving a relationship with the Father?

Point #2 - The exiles are longing for a "home" in the Father's love and in the Father's house

- Read Luke 15:17-18. Pastor Tim Keller says that when the younger son came to his senses, he had a longing for "home" again. Was there ever a time that you were away from the Father's house or the Father Himself? What made you long for "home" again?
- What kinds of "hunger" or emptiness do people experience today that might awaken their longing for God?

Point #3 - To welcome home the exiles, we must reflect the heart of the Father to them

- Read Luke 15:20-23. What does this tell you about the heart of the Father towards exiles and prodigals? Was there ever a time that someone helped you feel "seen" and "known" by the Father? If so, please share.
- Read Luke 15:29. Notice how the older brother's heart posture and mentality reflects that of a "guest" rather than a host. In what ways do you find yourself coming to church more as a guest to be served rather than a host who welcomes and serves others?

Application:

- As we learned in this week's teaching, in order to become a home for "exiles", we must be willing to reflect the Father's heart to them by "seeing" them, "welcoming" them, and "serving" them.
- **The Challenge:** Commit to serving just once a month for the next three months in one of the following ministries:
 - Hospitality
 - Parking
 - Newcomers
 - Thanksgiving Sunday (volunteer)
