SEE—DESIRE—TAKE


Genesis 3:6 - “When the woman saw that the fruit of the tree was good for food and pleasing to the eye, and also desirable for gaining wisdom, she took some and ate it.”

I. Confession is courageously naming our sin before God and others to receive forgiveness and healing

- James 5:16 – “Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed.”
- Proverbs 28:13 - “Whoever conceals their sins does not prosper, but the one who confesses and renounces them finds mercy.”
- Colossians 1:19-20 - “For God was pleased to have all his fullness dwell in him, and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether things on earth or things in heaven, by making peace through his blood, shed on the cross.

II. Practice of Confession

Cell Group Discussion Questions

Please note that due to having a guest speaker for this Sunday (11/16), we will have a shorter CG discussion guide for this week.

Digging Deeper:

1. Think about your closest relationships. Do you have 1–3 “safe people” who know the real you—including your struggles and failures? If yes, what makes them safe? If not, what would you need in order to take that kind of risk with someone?
2. Have you ever experienced healing through confession—either by confessing to someone or by someone confessing something to you? What happened? If you haven’t experienced this before, what do you think holds you back?
3. As we've been talking about confession, has any particular person come to mind—someone you’ve wronged and might need to reach out to?
