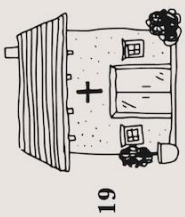
6. Living Hope Internships 2026-2027

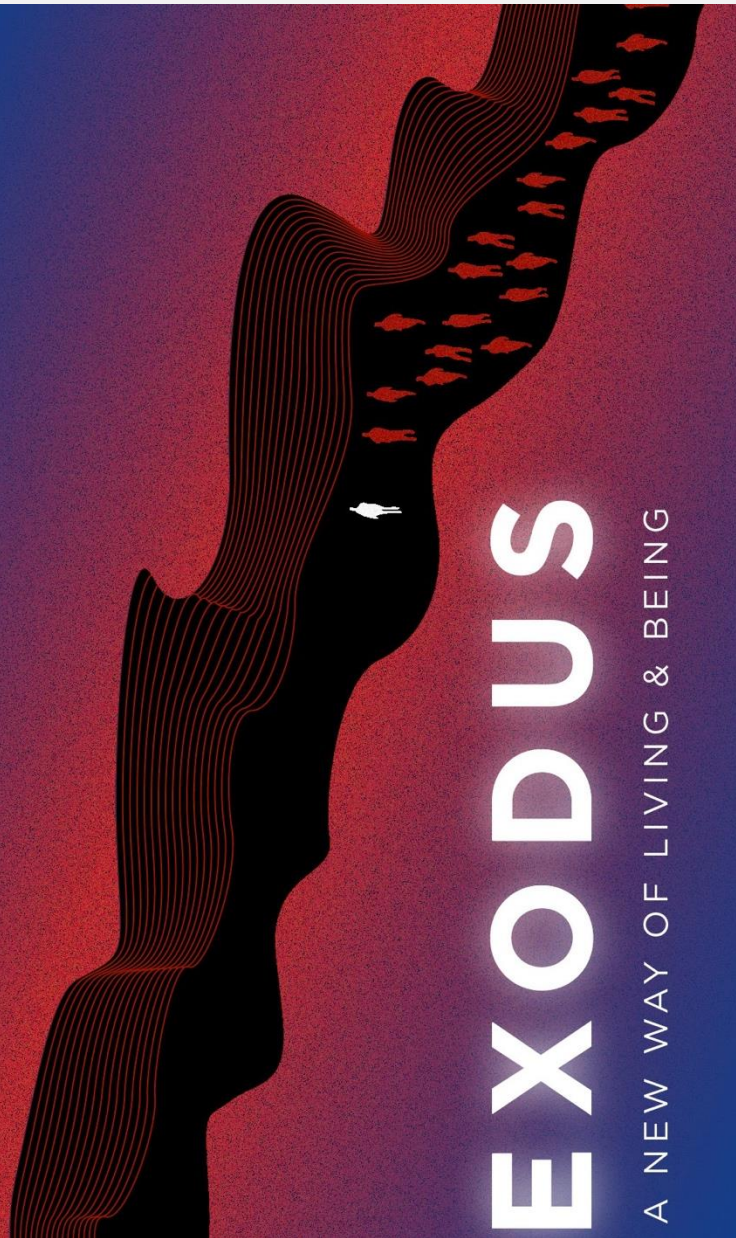

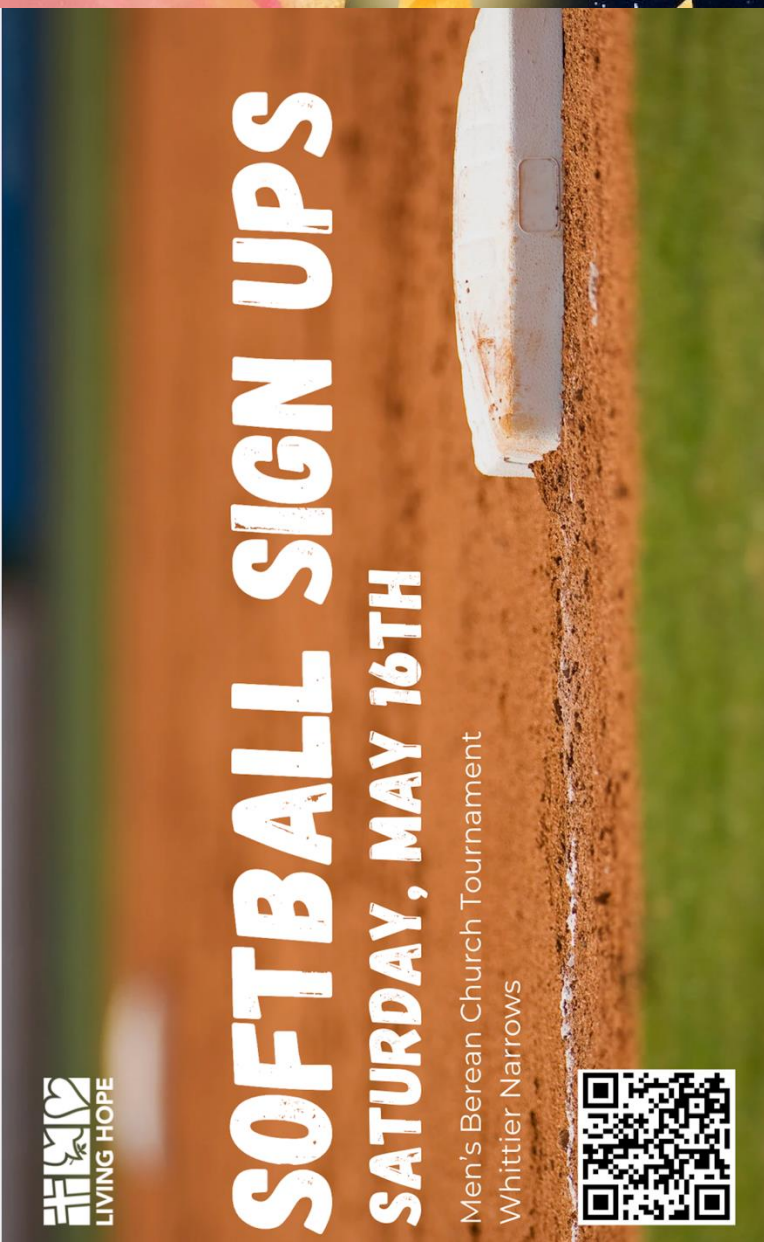

CELL GROUP DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Breaking the Ice:

- What is one activity that you prefer to do *with others* rather than doing *alone*? Why do you enjoy *sharing* it?

Digging Deeper:

Point #1: A relationship with God is a response to what He has done not a result of what we have done

- In Exodus 19:3 God calls the people to remember how he rescued them and saved them. Most of the time in life we tend to overlook, forget, and take for granted all that God does for us, from the little things such as being grateful to have breath to the big things of seeing gospel in our everyday lives. What are some ways we begin to be people who are better at remembering and embracing what God has done?

Point #2 – A relationship with God requires a surrender of identity

- Read Exodus 19:5-8 & 1 Peter 2:4-10
 - As a group reflect upon this: Does being called to be a “royal priesthood” for God feel like a burden or a privilege and why?
 - How can we better embrace and live out this identity in our everyday lives

Point #3 - A relationship with God is built on a sacred awe of Him

- Think about these two statements: “Familiarity breeds contempt.” “Compromise leads to sin”
- Is there any place in your walk with God that you have lost a sense of “sacred awe” because you have gotten too comfortable or because you have made compromises?
 - Does being late to service really have an impact on your walk with God?
 - Is it bad if prayer feels more habitual/routine then super intentional?
 - Do you really have to spend time “preparing yourself” before quiet time or worship? What is even the right way to “prepare yourself”

Closing Application & Prayer:

Close your time by praying together over the areas of your walk with God where you really need to continue protect (ie quiet time, serious approach to service) or the areas where you feel like you have let compromises cause you to lose your “sacred awe” (use of language, casual sin)

Ask God to:

- Give for the wisdom to navigate restoration in this
- For the power to repent and undo the compromises that were made
- To restore a sacred awe of Him
