“Thinking Biblically About Immigration”

1. Scripture consistently reveals God's care and concern for the sojourner

In the Old Testament:

- Exodus 22:19
- Exodus 23:9
- Leviticus 19:31-33

In the New Testament:

- Matthew 25:35-40
- Hebrews 13:1-3

2. Scripture also supports the rule of law while affirming the boundaries of nations

Support for the Rule of Law:

- Romans 13:1
- 1 Peter 2:13-14, 17
- Titus 3:1-7

Support for the Borders of Nations:

- Deuteronomy 32:8
- Acts 17:26

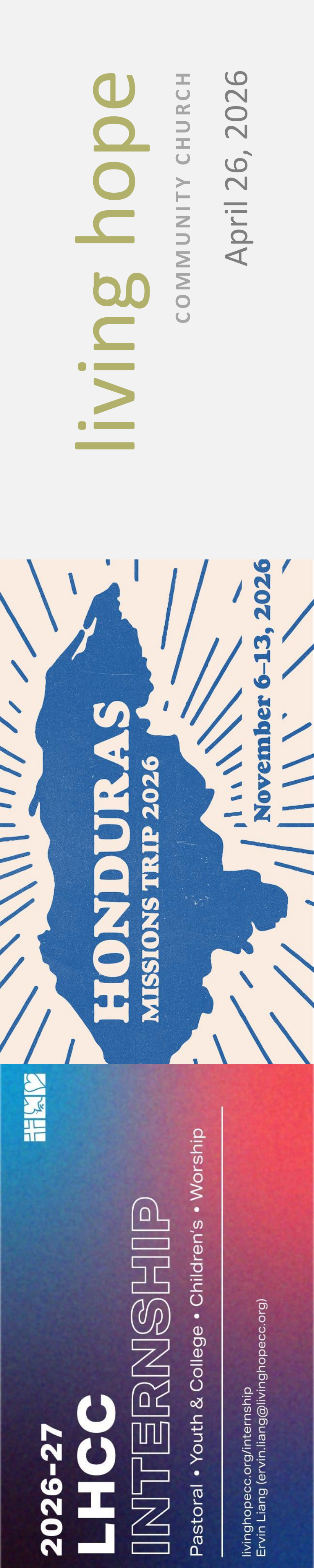

Closing Exhortations:

#1 – Be aware of your own confirmation bias (Proverbs 18:17; Matt 7:3-5)

#2 – Pursue unity (not uniformity) with gentleness, humility, and respect (Ephesians 4:1-3)

#3 – Remember the gospel (Ephesians 4:32)



CELL GROUP DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Breaking the Ice:

- What is your family’s story when it comes to coming to the U.S. (or moving from one place to another)?
- In what ways has your own story influenced how you think about or treat others with similar backgrounds or journeys?

Digging Deeper:

Point #1: Scripture consistently reveals God’s care and concern for the sojourner

Read: Leviticus 19:31-33; Matthew 25:35-40

Reflect:

- In Scripture, God consistently shows His concern for what is often called the “quartet of the vulnerable”. What were the four groups mentioned in Scripture?
- Why do you think God repeatedly highlights these groups throughout Scripture? What does this reveal about His heart?

Prayer:

- In smaller groups of 2-3 people, we encourage you to pray for the following:
 - For the vulnerable in our communities
 - Praying for immigrants and refugees - but also any others who belong in the quartet of vulnerable (widow, orphan, or the poor)
 - For those navigating fear, instability, or uncertainty

Point #2 – Scripture also supports the rule of law while affirming the boundaries of nations

Read:

- Support for the Rule of Law (Romans 13:1-2; 1 Peter 2:13-14, 17)
- Support for the Boundaries of Nations (Deuteronomy 32:8; Acts 17:26)

Reflect:

- Why do you think Scripture calls believers to submit to and honor governing authorities – even when those authorities may not uphold God’s standards of justice and righteousness?

Pray:

- Read 1 Timothy 2:1-2. Scripture not only calls us to support the rule of law, but to also honor governing authorities by praying for them. In smaller groups of 2-3 people, we encourage you to pray for the following:
 - Governing authorities at a national level
 - Governing officials at the state level
 - For governing authorities at a city level
 - For our nation as a whole

Point #3 – The gospel shapes how we live in the tension of both caring for the immigrant and honoring the rule of law

- Read Ephesians 2:12-13 and Titus 3:1-7
- How does remembering that we were once “strangers” and “foolish/disobedient” who were shown mercy by God shape the way we view and treat others?

Moving Beyond Prayer:

As a church, we want our reflection and prayer to lead us toward action. As God continually forms our hearts, we want to respond by loving and serving those around us in tangible ways. Here are a few opportunities to serve the vulnerable in our community:
