### 6. VBS 2026 | Volunteers

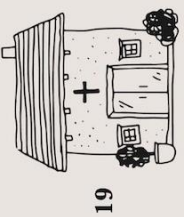

## SERMON NOTES

“Raised from Death to Life”

John 11:38-44

Pastor Jeff Hyun

**#1 – It is the call of Christ that brings us from death to life**

John 11:39 – “...for he has been dead four days.”

John 11:43-44 – “When he had said these things, **he cried out with a loud voice**, ‘Lazarus, come out.’ The man who had died came out...”

**#2 – It is the power of Christ that sets us free from the entanglement of sin**

John 11:44 – “The man who had died came out, **his hands and feet bound with linen strips, and his face wrapped with a cloth**. Jesus said to them, “**Unbind him, and let him go.**”

**#3 – It is faith in the person of Christ that ensures that we will be raised again to eternal life in the resurrection**

John 11:24-26 – “**24** Martha said to him, “I know that he will rise again in the resurrection on the last day.” **25** Jesus said to her, “I am the resurrection and the life.[d] Whoever believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live, **26** and everyone who lives and believes in me shall never die. Do you believe this?” **27** She said to him, “Yes, Lord; I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, who is coming into the world.”

## CELL GROUP DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

### Breaking the Ice:

Who is someone who has been an intercessor in your life - someone you know faithfully prayed for you during a meaningful or difficult season?

### Digging Deeper:

**Point #1: Intercession involves asking God for divine intervention on behalf of someone else**

In Exodus 17:9–10, what do you notice about the connection between what happens on the hill (Moses praying) and what happens on the battlefield (Israel fighting)?

What does this story teach us about the role of prayer in spiritual battles we cannot see?

**Point #2: Intercession is strengthened not only by praying *for* others, but by praying *with* others**

In Exodus 17:12, Moses needs Aaron and Hur to help hold up his arms. What does this teach us about why we need others when we pray?

Can you think of a situation in your life right now where you may be relying primarily on effort, strategy, or control rather than prayer?

**Point #3: The power of intercession comes from praying in Christ's authority – and not our own**

Read Exodus 17:9 again. Notice that when Moses prays, he doesn't just pray with his hands lifted up, but with the staff of God lifted up. Why is this the case?

### PRAYER PRACTICE FOR THE WEEK:

#### Standing in the Gap for Others

This week's practice invites you to intentionally pray for others and to allow prayer to become a shared responsibility rather than an individual effort.

#### Step 1: Name Who You Are Praying For?

Identify one or two people who are facing difficulty, uncertainty, or spiritual need. Bring their names before God intentionally.

#### Step 2: Pray with Others

Practice intercessory prayer this week—either in your Cell Group or in smaller triads. Pray simply, asking God to strengthen, guide, and protect those you are lifting before Him.

#### Step 3: Stay Engaged

Commit to praying for the same people throughout the week. Let prayer become a steady presence rather than a one-time moment.
