SERMON NOTES

“The God Who Dwells Among Us”

Exodus 25:1-9

The Tabernacle reveals:

1. God’s desire – to be with His people

Exodus 25:8 – “And let them make me a sanctuary, that *I may dwell in their midst.*”

2. God’s holiness – that He is holy, sacred, and set apart from His people

Exodus 25:9 – “⁹ Exactly as I show you concerning *the pattern of the tabernacle*, and of all its furniture, so you shall make it.”

3. God’s provision - a sacrifice that makes a way for Him to dwell in His people

Exodus 29:42-45 – “⁴² It shall be a regular burnt offering throughout your generations at the entrance of the tent of meeting before the LORD, where I will meet with you, to speak to you there. ⁴³ There I will meet with the people of Israel, and it shall be sanctified by my glory. ⁴⁴ I will consecrate the tent of meeting and the altar. Aaron also and his sons I will consecrate to serve me as priests. ⁴⁵ *I will dwell among the people of Israel and will be their God.*”

CELL GROUP DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Breaking the Ice:

1. Share about a time when someone made a sacrifice or significant change in order to be with you. What impact did their presence have on you?

Digging Deeper:

Point #1: God’s desire – to be with His people

2. Read Exodus 25:8 along with John 1:14 and Revelation 21:3. What do these passages all have in common with each other? And what does it reveal about how God wants to relate with His people?
3. In this season of your life, what circumstance or situation do you most need to be reminded that God is with you? Or that He desires to be with you?

Point #2: God’s holiness – that He is holy, sacred, and set apart from His people

4. Read Exodus 25:9. We learned that the entire *pattern* and structure of the tabernacle itself “preaches.” As you move from the outer court to the Holy Place to the Most Holy Place, what changes? What does this progression teach us about God’s holiness and approaching His presence?
5. The speaker talked about how our culture has lost a sense of what is sacred. Where do you see this most clearly in society today?

Point #3: God’s provision – a sacrifice that makes a way for Him to dwell *in* His people

6. In Exodus 26:31-37, we see that God gives elaborate instructions about a curtain and veil that was to be constructed. What did the curtain and veil teach Israel about where they stood in relation to God?
7. Through Jesus, God not only dwells among us, but now dwells within us. What is one practical way you can cultivate greater awareness of God’s presence in your daily life this week?
