SERMON NOTES

“From Slavery to Sanctuary”

Exodus 31:1-11

Pastor Ben Tabbal

1. God sees and calls people by name

2. God fills ordinary people with His Spirit

3. God sends His people to build what matters



CELL GROUP DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Breaking the Ice:

- What is one ordinary task or responsibility that takes up a lot of your weekly life right now?
- What is a skill, hobby, or type of work you enjoy doing?

Digging Deeper:

Movement#1: God sees and calls people by name

Read Exodus 31:1-2

- What stands out to you about the way God calls Bezalel?
- Why do you think it matters that God calls him “by name” before giving him a task?
- The sermon talked about how Israel spent over 400 years building for Pharaoh.

Discuss:

- What are some ways the world shapes people’s identity or purpose today?

Personal Reflection

- The sermon said: “The hands that once built slavery now help build sanctuary.”
- Where have you seen God redeem parts of your story, experiences, or abilities for something better?

Movement #2: God fills ordinary people with His Spirit

Read Exodus 31:3–5.

- Why is it surprising that the first person specifically described as Spirit-filled in Scripture is a craftsman?
- What does this teach us about the kinds of work God values?

The sermon said: “God’s Spirit turns ordinary work into sacred calling.”

Discuss:

- How might this change the way we view work, parenting, serving, caregiving, everyday responsibilities?

Personal Reflection

- What is one “ordinary” area of your life where you need to remember that God sees your faithfulness?

Movement #3: God sends His people to build what matters

Read Exodus 31:4–11

- Why do you think God gave Bezalel both gifts and a purpose?
- What stood out to you about Oholiab and the idea that kingdom work is done together?

The sermon said: “When we only see the stones, we miss the sanctuary God is building.”

Discuss:

- What are some “stones” in your life right now that may actually be part of something God is building?

Personal Application

1. Which movement of the gospel do you most relate to right now? Why?

Slavery, Seen, Called, Filled, Sent

2. Where do you need to let God reshape your identity?

3. What gifts, skills, or experiences might God want to use for His kingdom?

4. What would it look like for your ordinary life to become sacred calling?

Prayer Time

Invite people to share:

- an area where they feel unseen
- an area where they feel tired or ordinary
- a place where they sense God calling or stretching them

Pray:

- for Spirit-filled faithfulness
- for renewed purpose
- for courage to build what matters eternally
