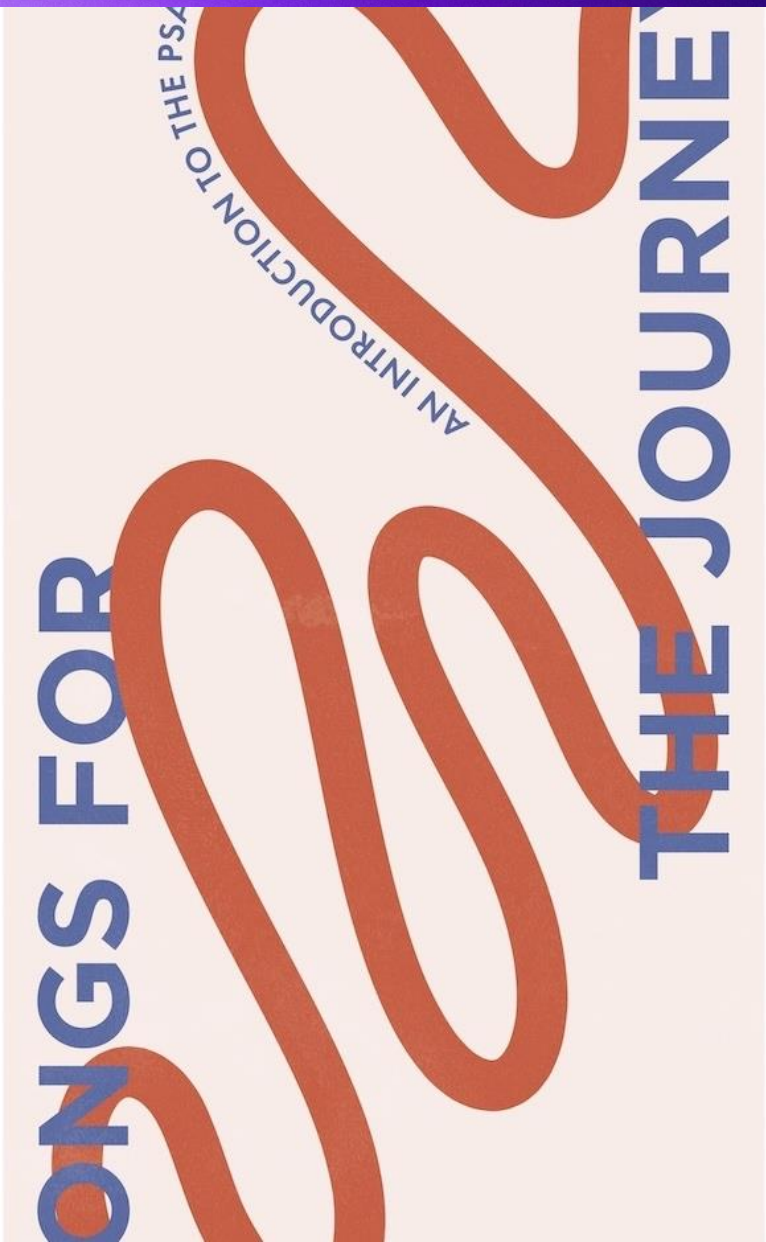

SERMON NOTES

“God Has a Name”

Exodus 33:17-19; 34:1-9

Point #1 – The name of God reveals that God is personal and relational

Exodus 33:19 – “And he said, ‘I will make all my goodness pass before you and **will proclaim before you my name ‘The Lord’**”.

Exodus 34:6 – “The Lord passed before him and proclaimed, “**The Lord, the Lord...**”

Point #2 – The name of God reveals that God is covenantal

Exodus 34:6 – “The Lord passed before him and proclaimed, “**The Lord, the Lord...**”

Exodus 3:15 – “ “Say this to the people of Israel: ‘**The Lord**, the God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, has sent me to you.’ **This is my name forever**, and thus I am to be remembered throughout all generations.”

Exodus 6:3 – “I appeared to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, as **God Almighty**, but by my name **the Lord** I did not make myself known to them.”

Point #3 – The name of God reveals that God is love

Exodus 34:6 – “The Lord passed before him and proclaimed, “**The Lord, the Lord**, a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness...”

1 Corinthians 13:4-7 – “4 Love is patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant 5 or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; 6 it does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth. 7 Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.”

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CELL GROUP DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Breaking the Ice:

1. Go around and share: What is your name, and what's the meaning or story behind it? (If you don't know, you can look it up on the internet)

Digging Deeper:

Point #1 – The name of God reveals that God is personal and relational

2. Read Exodus 33:19. God tells Moses he cannot see His face, yet He proclaims His name. What is that name and why does the English translation not pick up on it?
3. In his book, *God Has a Name*, John Mark Comer writes – “What you call somebody says a lot about your relationship.” When you examine your prayer life, what is the name you most often call God – and what might that reveal about the kind of relationship that you have with Him right now?

Point #2 – The name of God reveals that God is covenantal

4. Read Exodus 6:3. We learned that in the past, God was called *Elohim* (Gen 1:1) and made Himself known as *El Shaddai* (Gen 17:1). Now He discloses Himself by His personal name, Yahweh. Why is that progression significant – what does God reveal about Himself in giving His name that the earlier titles didn't fully capture?
5. In your closest relationships, is there a name or nickname someone you love has given you? If so, share what it is – and what it reveals about that relationship that you have with that person.

Point #3 – The name of God reveals that God is love

6. Read Exodus 34:6. In this week's teaching, we learned that this verse is “the most quoted verse in the Bible, by the Bible.” (Comer, *God Has a Name*) Of all the names and descriptions God uses of Himself here — merciful, gracious, slow to anger, abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness — which one resonates with you the most right now, and why?
