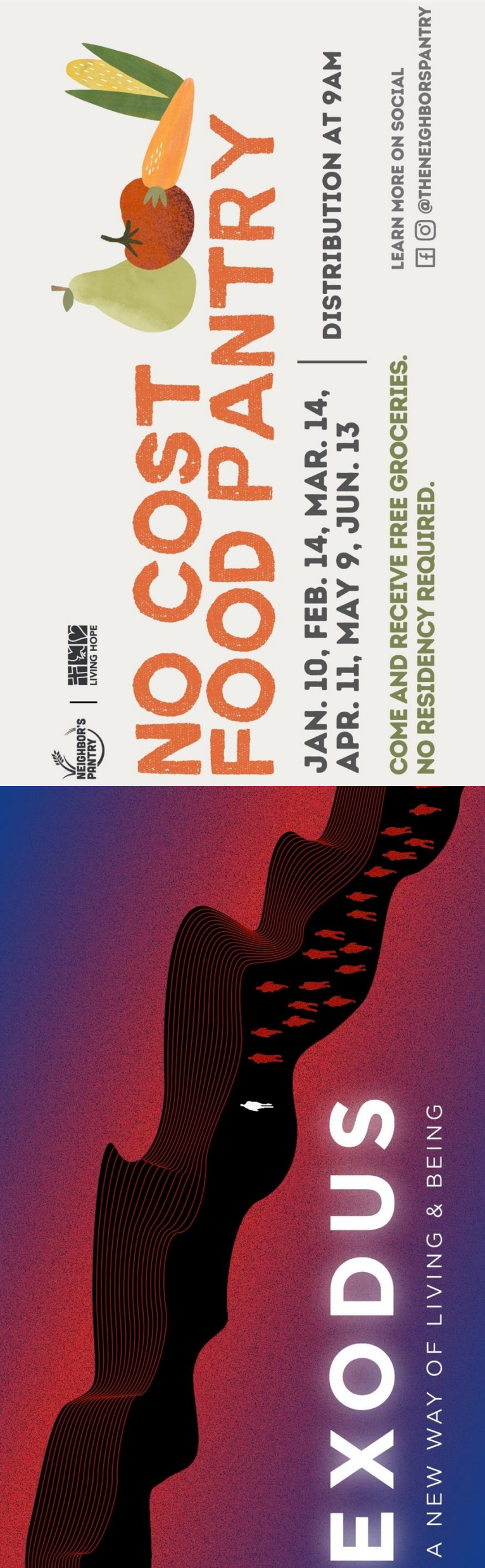
### 7. Living Hope Internships 2026-2027

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## SERMON NOTES

“A People of Covenant”

Exodus 24:1-11

### 1. The Vow: A people who are committed to the book

- Exodus 24:3 – “Moses came and told the people all the words of the Lord and all the rules. And all the people answered with one voice and said, “All the words that the Lord has spoken we will do.”
- Exodus 24:7 – “Then he took the Book of the Covenant and read it in the hearing of the people. And they said, ‘All that the Lord has spoken we will do, and we will be obedient.’”

### 2. The Seal: A people who are bound by the blood

- Exodus 24:6 – “And Moses took half of the blood and put it in basins, and half of the blood he threw against the altar.”
- Exodus 24:8 – “And Moses took the blood and threw it on the people and said, ‘Behold the blood of the covenant that the LORD has made with you in accordance with all these words.’”

### 3. The Meal: A people who live in communion with God

- Exodus 24:9-11 – “Then Moses and Aaron, Nadab, and Abihu, and seventy of the elders of Israel went up, and they saw the God of Israel. There was under his feet as it were a pavement of sapphire stone, like the very heaven for clearness. And he did not lay his hand on the chief men of the people of Israel; they beheld God, and ate and drank.



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CELL GROUP DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Breaking the Ice:

1. What is one commitment that you made recently - big or small?

Digging Deeper:

Point #1: The Vow: A people who are committed to the book

2. Read Exodus 24:3 & 7. What do you notice about how the people respond to God’s Word in Book of Exodus 24:3 and 24:7? What would you say are the key repeated phrases or added emphasis in these two verses?
3. As you reflect on your life, which part of God’s Word are hardest for you to fully embrace or live out right now?

Point #2 – The Seal: A people bound by the blood

4. Read Exodus 24:6-8. Notice carefully what Moses does with the blood and how it is applied. Why do you think it is significant that he goes to apply the blood on *both* the altar and the people?
5. We learned that because we are bound to Christ by His blood, we belong fully to Him. What are the things in your life that tend to pull you away from your devotion to Christ?

Point #3 – The Meal: A people who live in communion with God

6. What differences do you notice between Exodus 24:1-2 and 24:9-11 in how the people relate to God? What do you think accounts for that change?
7. Since we now have access to draw near and commune with the living God through Christ, what is one simple, practical way you’ve been connecting with Him recently (e.g. a specific worship song, praying in silence, devotions, journaling, etc.). Please share.
