Sermon Series: Romans: Gospel Partnership Sermon Text: Romans 5:6-11 (ESV) Sermon Title: Shaped by the Gospel

⁶ For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. ⁷ For one will scarcely die for a righteous person—though perhaps for a good person one would dare even to die—⁸ but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. ⁹ Since, therefore, we have now been justified by his blood, much more shall we be saved by him from the wrath of God. ¹⁰ For if while we were enemies we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, much more, now that we are reconciled, shall we be saved by his life. ¹¹ More than that, we also rejoice in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation.

We are looking this morning at Romans 5:6-11. We need to recognize that an encounter with God's love will never leave you unchanged. Maybe that is why, as Christians, we struggle with God's love. Not necessarily believing intellectually in God's love, but being embraced, gripped by His love. Because deep down we know that His love is a power that will change us, and we do not really want to change.

The passage we explored last week, Romans 5:1-5, ended with the words, "God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us." In other words, when you become a Christian, you get a subjective experience of God's love that empowers us to love God in return. And then v.6 begins with the word "for" showing us that this passage (vv.6-11) is closely connected to what preceded it, namely, God's love being poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit.

Thus, the flow of thought in the entire passage of vv.1-11 is that vv.1-5 speak of the reality of our living hope while vv.6-11 give us the ground of that hope. In other words, we learn here how we are shaped by the gospel. And this morning we will explore the ground of our living hope that shapes us in the gospel in two ways:

- I. Because of God's Benevolent Grace
- II. Because of God's Comprehensive Grace
