Sermon Series: Romans: Gospel Partnership Sermon Text: Romans 4:1-8 (ESV) Sermon Title: Our Family Story

What then shall we say was gained by Abraham, our forefather according to the flesh? ² For if Abraham was justified by works, he has something to boast about, but not before God. ³ For what does the Scripture say? "Abraham believed God, and it was counted to him as righteousness." ⁴ Now to the one who works, his wages are not counted as a gift but as his due. ⁵ And to the one who does not work but believes in him who justifies the ungodly, his faith is counted as righteousness, ⁶ just as David also speaks of the blessing of the one to whom God counts righteousness apart from works:

- "Blessed are those whose lawless deeds are forgiven, and whose sins are covered;
- blessed is the man against whom the Lord will not count his sin."

We have been studying through Paul's magnum opus, the letter to the Romans, the great doctrine of justification by faith. The truth that God, by his grace, declares us to be both forgiven and righteous in his sight through the work of his Son, Jesus Christ.

One of the other great blessings of this doctrine, a sometimes-overlooked blessing, is that by faith in Christ we are also brought into the family of God. That we are one with God and with one another. We are a part of the covenant family of God. In Romans 4:1-8 Paul describes the means by which, in fulfillment of God's covenant promises, both Jews and Gentiles receive this gift of righteousness and become part of his family.

So, we are looking at our family story. What kind of family, what are the values, the ethos, the DNA of this covenant family? Paul highlights in this passage two of our family leaders, exploring what our family looks like, and what it means for us to be a part of God's covenant family.

And so, in this text we will look at two things:

- 1. Through Abraham We Learn that God's Family is a Family of Faith
- 2. Through David We Learn that God's Family is a Family of Grace

Faith and grace. Two prominent themes in Paul's letter to the Romans. You would think we would understand them by now and wouldn't have to keep relearning these lessons. We always need to return to faith and grace and to see how this unmerited, undeserved, and unearned favor cultivates in God's family the characteristics of thanksgiving and humility. May God cultivate this fruit in us as we encounter him through his Word.

Reflection

"So here is the most truly radical thing of all. Abraham, far from being a model of righteousness, is first and foremost the original justified sinner, the original "ungodly" person who is reshaped by God into godliness, not because of his own deeds but because of the God who does the unimaginable thing – the God who justifies, rectifies, redeems, and remakes the least acceptable, most ungodly person." (Fleming Rutledge, Not Ashamed of the Gospel)
