Sermon Series: Why the Church? The Heart of the Gospel Galatians 2:11-16 (ESV)

¹¹But when Cephas came to Antioch, I opposed him to his face, because he stood condemned. ¹²For before certain men came from James, he was eating with the Gentiles; but when they came he drew back and separated himself, fearing the circumcision party. ¹³And the rest of the Jews acted hypocritically along with him, so that even Barnabas was led astray by their hypocrisy. ¹⁴But when I saw that their conduct was not in step with the truth of the gospel, I said to Cephas before them all, "If you, though a Jew, live like a Gentile and not like a Jew, how can you force the Gentiles to live like Jews?"

¹⁵ We ourselves are Jews by birth and not Gentile sinners; ¹⁶ yet we know that a person is not justified by works of the law but through faith in Jesus Christ, so we also have believed in Christ Jesus, in order to be justified by faith in Christ and not by works of the law, because by works of the law no one will be justified.

For several months we have been exploring the topic of the missional church: why God created and designed this thing called the church and what God's mission is that leads to the church's vocation. We have been saying that the vocation of the church is to be God's instruments in bringing the hope, renewal, and healing of the gospel to our communities for the glory of God.

That is a big calling and a bold vision which leads to a question. Where do we get the power to do it? In other words, is there a key to the church's ability to implement this call from God? The Scriptures teach us that there is. And that key is the gospel. As Tim Keller puts it, "The key to continual and deeper spiritual renewal and revival is the continual rediscovery of the gospel."

So, for the final two weeks of this series, we are going to be exploring two seminal passages in Paul's letter to the Galatians. This week, we will be looking at Galatians 2:11-16. The book of Galatians is all about the sufficiency of Christ and the gospel. In the passage we are exploring this morning, Paul lays out a powerful principle for how to live the Christian life. In other words, he gives us a model for how the gospel is the power for our sanctification.

In this passage we will see three things:

- I. What Is the Principle?
- II. How Does the Principle Work?
- III. Where Do I Live Out the Principle?
