Sermon Series: Romans: Gospel Partnership Sermon Text: Romans 7:7-12 (ESV) Sermon Title: Is God's Law Good?

⁷ What then shall we say? That the law is sin? By no means! Yet if it had not been for the law, I would not have known sin. For I would not have known what it is to covet if the law had not said, "You shall not covet." ⁸ But sin, seizing an opportunity through the commandment, produced in me all kinds of covetousness. For apart from the law, sin lies dead. ⁹ I was once alive apart from the law, but when the commandment came, sin came alive and I died. ¹⁰ The very commandment that promised life proved to be death to me. ¹¹ For sin, seizing an opportunity through the commandment, deceived me and through it killed me. ¹² So the law is holy, and the commandment is holy and righteous and good.

What is your attitude toward the law? Is it ambivalent? Do you view it as a good thing all the time? How about its purpose? What is the purpose of the law? Paul has just finished telling the Romans that as believers in Christ they have a new relationship to the law, having been released from the law so that they can serve God in the new way of the Spirit. What does all this mean?

Paul brackets his teaching in vv.7 and 12 by declaring that the law is not to blame. The problem is our sin. Verse 7 begins the passage by asking, "is the law sin?" And, of course, he says, "By no means." Then he closes the passage by asserting that the law is holy, and the commandment is holy and righteous and good.

So, in this passage we will see that Paul focuses his teaching on two fundamental points.

- I. The Goodness of the Law
- II. The Impotence of the Law

Paul affirms the goodness of the law, stating that the law promises life to those who keep it and death to those who break it. In doing so he is also highlighting the law's impotence in securing our salvation because, of course, we don't keep the law faithfully. We are all law breakers. And it is in seeing this, in coming to the end of ourselves that we can fly to Jesus Christ who died in our place. Oh, that we would see the utter impossibility of our saving ourselves and run to Jesus Christ and live.

Reflection
