Sermon Text: 1 Corinthians 15:50-58 (ESV) Sermon Title: The Swallowing of Death

<sup>50</sup> I tell you this, brothers: flesh and blood cannot inherit the kingdom of God, nor does the perishable inherit the imperishable. <sup>51</sup> Behold! I tell you a mystery. We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed, <sup>52</sup> in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, and the dead will be raised imperishable, and we shall be changed. <sup>53</sup> For this perishable body must put on the imperishable, and this mortal body must put on immortality. <sup>54</sup> When the perishable puts on the imperishable, and the mortal puts on immortality, then shall come to pass the saying that is written:

"Death is swallowed up in victory."

55 "O death, where is your victory?

O death, where is your sting?"

<sup>56</sup> The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. <sup>57</sup> But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

<sup>58</sup> Therefore, my beloved brothers, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain.

Theologian N.T. Wright says, "The resurrection is, indeed, the foundation for a renewed way of life in and for the world."

But do we really understand the significance of the resurrection? Is it the foundation of your hope, and of your life, in and for the world? This morning, we will be looking at a seminal text on the resurrection from Paul's first letter to the church at Corinth. As we explore 1 Corinthians 15:50-58, we will ask three questions of the text that Paul answers.

- I. Why Do We Need the Resurrection?
- II. What Is the Result of the Resurrection?
- III. How Does the Resurrection Change Us?

As Paul has said already in this chapter, "If there is no resurrection then there is no Christianity. No forgiveness, no life, no hope." But, the resurrection is true, and therefore, as we have been saying, death does not have the final word, resurrection does. May that be your hope this Easter and always.

#### Reflection

"Jesus died for us to destroy the ultimacy of death over us. He was resurrected from the grave so that a new life could be birthed in us. He now lives in us and unites us to God." (Robert E. Webber, The Divine Embrace)
