Sermon Text: John 21:1-14 (ESV) Sermon Title: After the Resurrection

After this Jesus revealed himself again to the disciples by the Sea of Tiberias, and he revealed himself in this way. ² Simon Peter, Thomas (called the Twin), Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two others of his disciples were together. ³ Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing." They said to him, "We will go with you." They went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing.

⁴ Just as day was breaking, Jesus stood on the shore; yet the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. ⁵ Jesus said to them, "Children, do you have any fish?" They answered him, "No." ⁶ He said to them, "Cast the net on the right side of the boat, and you will find some." So they cast it, and now they were not able to haul it in, because of the quantity of fish. ⁷ That disciple whom Jesus loved therefore said to Peter, "It is the Lord!" When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put on his outer garment, for he was stripped for work, and threw himself into the sea. ⁸ The other disciples came in the boat, dragging the net full of fish, for they were not far from the land, but about a hundred yards off.

⁹ When they got out on land, they saw a charcoal fire in place, with fish laid out on it, and bread. ¹⁰ Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish that you have just caught." ¹¹ So Simon Peter went aboard and hauled the net ashore, full of large fish, 153 of them. And although there were so many, the net was not torn. ¹² Jesus said to them, "Come and have breakfast." Now none of the disciples dared ask him, "Who are you?" They knew it was the Lord. ¹³ Jesus came and took the bread and gave it to them, and so with the fish. ¹⁴ This was now the third time that Jesus was revealed to the disciples after he was raised from the dead.

Eastertide is the period of the church calendar known as Easter season. It is the period from Easter Sunday through Pentecost Sunday. It is basically the full Easter period beginning with the resurrection and concluding with the outpouring of the Spirit on Pentecost. Since Easter is the high point of the Church Year, Eastertide gives the church an opportunity to enjoy what has come to be known as fifty days of feasting.

It also gives us an opportunity to explore some of Jesus' encounters with his disciples after the resurrection. John 21 is a case in point. John 21 consists of two passages dealing with interactions between the disciples and the risen Jesus. We are going to be looking at the first interaction this morning found in John 21:1-14.

Jesus is equipping his disciples to carry out His mission in the kingdom of God. Resurrection leads to mission for the church. The church is called to go out as representatives of God's kingdom and proclaim the gospel in both word and deed to the world in evangelism. We are to do so as the newly constituted Christian community. This is the mission of God's new society in and for the world.

In these verses this morning, we will explore two lessons about Jesus' mission and our role in it.

- II. Jesus' Commitment to Mission
