Sermon Series: Romans: Gospel Partnership Sermon Text: Romans 8:5-11 (ESV) Sermon Title: The Ministry of the Spirit

⁹ You, however, are not in the flesh but in the Spirit, if in fact the Spirit of God dwells in you. Anyone who does not have the Spirit of Christ does not belong to him. ¹⁰ But if Christ is in you, although the body is dead because of sin, the Spirit is life because of righteousness. ¹¹ If the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ Jesus from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through his Spirit who dwells in you.

We are continuing to look this morning at Romans, the Bible's Mount Everest. We are taking our next step in this journey, the next movement in Paul's great cantata of the gospel. We mentioned last week that Romans is perhaps the best exposition of the ministry and work of the Holy Spirit. So, this morning we are exploring vv.5-11 and the ministry of the Holy Spirit.

One of my favorite books on the Holy Spirit is J. I. Packer's classic work, *Keep in Step With the Spirit*. In it he details how the Spirit's main function, according to John 16:14, is to bring glory to Christ by taking from what is His and manifesting it to us. Packer's illustration is that the Spirit is like a floodlight that shines on Jesus. If the floodlight is doing its job properly you never see the floodlight, only the object it is shining on.

And that object is Jesus. The Spirit is in love with Jesus, and His work is to bring us into love with the Son of God. Packer calls the Spirit "The great matchmaker."

⁵ For those who live according to the flesh set their minds on the things of the flesh, but those who live according to the Spirit set their minds on the things of the Spirit. ⁶ For to set the mind on the flesh is death, but to set the mind on the Spirit is life and peace. ⁷ For the mind that is set on the flesh is hostile to God, for it does not submit to God's law; indeed, it cannot. ⁸ Those who are in the flesh cannot please God.

We will explore this text by looking at two ways the Spirit is changing us. The Spirit transforms us by:

- I. Giving Us a New Direction
- II. Giving Us a New Life
