Our Ultimate Hope

He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away. And he who was seated on the throne said, "Behold, I am making all things new." (Revelation 21:4-5)

These verses provide the Christian with a beautiful hope for their future and for the end of history. As we celebrate Easter, the Lord's resurrection, and the defeat of death, let's spend a few moments focusing on our ultimate hope and its significance for our day-to-day lives.

My favorite time of year is the period between the beginning of March and the middle of April. As an avid sports fan, I believe that it is the pinnacle of the sports calendar. You have March Madness (which, if you don't know is the college basketball tournament), opening day of the baseball season, and the Masters golf tournament. Epic to be sure. Also, during this time of year you have Easter, and, at least for me, all these things serve to remind me of new life and the renewal of all things. In other words, our ultimate hope.

We are a people in need of a living, powerful hope and we live in a world desperately in need of hope. Listen to the language used in Revelation. Death, mourning, crying, pain. That is the context in which we live. We see it all around us. That is the context in which your neighbors live. And what do we need? Hope. Hope is what can not only sustain us but galvanize us to live authentically and powerfully in the present. Tim Keller defined hope this way: "How you handle your present is completely determined by what you believe your future to be. A hope is a future prospect, something so great and so good that it makes it possible to face the hardships, to face the difficulties. It makes it possible to feel everything you do, even the greatest sacrifices, are meaningful, not pointless." (Timothy Keller, The Amazing End of History, Timothy Keller Sermon Archive, Logos Bible Software).

Our ultimate hope is the resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ. We look forward, we ache, we groan for the new heavens and new earth. To the degree that we allow our hearts to be melted by that future prospect, it will transform us in the present. I love how theologian N.T. Wright put in his book, *Surprised by Hope*, "What we say about death and resurrection gives shape and color to everything else. If we are not careful, we will offer merely a 'hope' that is no longer a surprise, no longer able to transform lives and communities in the present, no longer generated by the resurrection of Jesus himself and looking forward to the promised new heavens and new earth...The resurrection is indeed the foundation for a renewed way of life in and for the world." (N.T. Wright, Surprised by Hope: Rethinking Heaven, the Resurrection, and the Mission of the Church, pp.25,294).

Life is hard. We do not sugarcoat it. But Easter changes everything. Wouldn't it be incredible if we let it change us not only at Easter time but every day? Let's be a people of hope, offering hope to our own hearts, each other, and our neighbors around us.


Officer Rotation and Election
