What Does a Missional Church Do?

For the last several of months, I have been speaking with you about being a missional church. We have explored issues of vision and purpose, and the idea that it is God who has a mission and that our job is to be His instruments in serving His mission.

This month, I want to get a bit more practical and give just a couple of examples of what a missional church does. What does a missional church look like? Let's look at a couple of things:

First, a missional church is a praying church. A cursory look through the book of Acts shows us the commitment of the early church to prayer.

"All these with one accord were devoting themselves to prayer, together with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus, and his brothers," (Acts 1:14).

"And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers," (Acts 2:42).

"And when they had prayed, the place in which they were gathered together was shaken, and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and continued to speak the word of God with boldness," (Acts 4:31).

"About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the prisoners were listening to them," (Acts 16:25).

"And when he had said these things, he knelt down and prayed with them all," (Acts 20:36).

The early church clearly believed that their power came from constant communion and dependence upon God.

Next, a missional church is involved in their community. A missional church gets up early on a Saturday morning to give away school supplies to nearly 500 students. A huge thank you to Harold and Teresa Parker and Russell Puppe, who joined Evie and me at Greene County High School to wish the kids going back to school a good year and making sure they were well

supplied with facial tissues, hand sanitizer, and knew about our upcoming ESL classes. Or a missional church comes out on a Tuesday evening to the church parking lot to participate in a National Night Out, affording an opportunity to interact with those who serve and protect our community in various emergency situations.

What do these things have in common? They afford us the chance to do life with and develop relationships with those around us. We get to hear others' stories and share ours, enter others' lives, and most importantly, share the true story of the whole world, the story of the gospel.

Remember, God is working in the lives of everyone we meet. We may not know what God is doing but we can have confidence that God is at work. We get the privilege of coming alongside what God is already doing to see where God might want to use us. We do this, remembering the instruction we receive in Peter's first letter, "But in your hearts honor Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and respect" (1 Peter 3:15).

everyone please sign up in the narthex with your name and what you plan to bring. Please remember that Pastor Jeff has a food allergy, so we request dishes without onion!




The Victory Train of Greensboro
