

### Dependent Prayer

"Perhaps you don't drift the way that I do, but I constantly forget the deep hole of depravity from which the Lord's mighty love rescued me. Drifting does not take any effort at all; just stop cultivating the knowledge of Christ, and the evil current of secularism does the rest. All passion for the lost seems increasingly a fading memory. Jesus weeping over Jerusalem, Paul willing to be cursed for the sake of his countrymen, those things become very remote to the point of being unreal." (C. John Miller, The Heart of a Servant Leader, p.70)

I was very thankful for our congregational meeting the other day. I was thankful for the work and service of so many to further the work of the gospel in our community. I was grateful for the vulnerability and honesty of so many who asked questions, raised concerns, and gave input for us as leaders. I am grateful for the leaders, the session, deacons, staff, and facilities task force, for their work, sacrifice, and commitment to see the Lake country "filled with the knowledge of the glory of the LORD as the waters cover the sea," (Habakkuk 2:14). I love being a part of a church that is committed to the

Scriptures and the gospel.

Why are we doing LOPC 2.0? Why are we renovating our facilities? Why do we do anything we do? If it is not to love God more deeply with our whole being, if it is not simply because we are following Jesus, if it is not connected to our discipleship, we are doing it for the wrong reason. For example, why do we give? God does not ask for our money because He needs it. He doesn't need anything from us. He asks us to give because it transforms us. God is interested in our hearts. God wants us.

And so, we are doing LOPC 2.0 because we are following Jesus. And following Jesus transforms us. So, this is about our discipleship, our love for God, our following Jesus into the community. Jack Miller's quote above reminded me of this when he confessed (as I must as well) just how easy it is to drift, especially to drift away from our love for God. He confessed how easy it is to lose passion for the lost, to drift from loving our neighbors like Jesus wept over Jerusalem, to forget that Paul, more than simply being a theologian, had a such a love for his fellow countrymen that he prayed to be cut off from God for the sake of their salvation. It is way too easy to drift from having a burden for the people in our community.

So, how do we respond? Dependent prayer. But not any old prayer. I want us to pray for ourselves. For our transformation, for our renewal. I want us to pray dependently, remembering Jesus' promise to us given in John 14. *Truly, truly, I say to you, whoever believes in me will also do the works that I do; and greater works than these will he do, because I am going to the Father.*Whatever you ask in my name, this I will do, that the Father may be glorified in the Son. If you ask anything in my name, I will do it," (John 14:12-14).

These are incredible promises. Jesus promises that because He is going to His Father, we will do even greater works than he did, and that is because when He goes to the Father, He pours out His Spirit on His church. Jesus is saying it is due to the gift of the Spirit that we will do these greater works. Then, he promises that whatever we ask in his name, he will do, for the purpose that the Father may be glorified in the Son. Jesus' passion is the glory of the Father. What is our passion? What is it we want most? Searching questions, I know, and I must ask them of myself every day. But incredible promises. Jesus promises that whatever we ask in his name he will do in order to glorify the Father. That should give us incredible confidence as we approach God in prayer.

I long for renewal in my own heart and life and for us as a church. I am grateful for LOPC 2.0 because it challenges me, and it challenges us. It challenges us to reflect on our own spiritual condition, to do so knowing we have the freedom to be honest because the gospel is true. The gospel tells us that there is no condemnation in Christ, that we are forgiven, that God accepts us as righteous, that He adopts us as His children, that we are not alone since He has given us His Spirit. The gospel is the power of God for salvation and I long for us to be rooted in the gospel for the renewal of Lake Oconee and the world.

## Fall Discipleship Plan

#### **Missional Community Groups**


- Missional Community Lifestyle Training: As we launch our small group ministry in the fall called Missional Community Groups, we are providing a time of envisioning and training. We will meet on August 16, from 5:30-7:00pm. Missional Community is a family of disciples sent on mission to grow, serve, and go make disciples. On August 16, we will discuss how we serve as missionaries, sharing the Gospel and serving where we live, work, learn and play. This is for those interested in leading or attending a group. We will share a meal together at 5:30pm with the church providing the main course (lasagna) and attendees providing a side to share. See the signup sheet in the Narthex to register.
- Missional Community Pilot Groups (formerly Home Fellowship Groups): We will Launch a Missional Community Pilot Group on September 20th on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday nights from 5:30-7:00pm through December 6<sup>th</sup> in the Narthex/Sanctuary. This Pilot Group is our onramp to Missional Community Groups. It will be a six-week small group experience where we will lay the foundation for Missional Community Groups with discussion around tables. We will share a potluck meal at 5:30pm and continue with small groups for Adults and Youth, an Elementary Kids Club with a Bible Study, and nursery for children ages birth-three at 6:00pm.

### **Sunday Learning Communities (formerly Sunday School classes)**

Our Sunday School ministry called Sunday Learning Communities will begin September 10 for all ages. Adults and youth will meet in the Sanctuary, infants-toddlers will meet in Choir Room 102, and elementary will meet in Choir Room 101.

- Adult/Youth Learning Community: The adults and youth will meet together in the sanctuary and study God's Big Picture by Vaughn Roberts. Vaughan Roberts gives you the big picture--showing how the different parts of the Bible fit together under the theme of the kingdom of God.
- Elementary Learning Community: Elementary age children will study the Jesus Storybook Bible Old Testament section.
- **Toddler Learning Community:** Toddlers will explore God's creation and utilize a curriculum called *Building Little Pillars: Teaching the Foundations of the Christian Faith.*
