Beholding Glory

I remember taking a class one time with Tim Keller where he was teaching on worship. He stated that the essence of worship was surprise. Not surprised where somebody says, "Boo!" to you and you jump, but surprise in the sense that the Holy Spirit, working through His Word, impresses upon you something that can either challenge, comfort, teach or in some way show you something about God in a new way. Your being is engaged and as God reveals Himself to you, you are changed in some way.

Maybe this has something to do with coming to Jesus like a little child, for children have a unique capacity to be surprised, to look at life with a wide-eyed wonder, a sense of adventure, that - if we're honest - we often need to recover. Jesus instructs us that we are to come to him like little children. How open are we to being surprised by what we discover in God's Word as we worship, whether privately or corporately? Do we need to recover a sense of that wonder as we engage with God?

That's where Christmas comes in. Not that we should read this verse only at Christmas, but John 1:14 speaks to us of the inbreaking of God into this fallen world to accomplish salvation. It says, "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father,

full of grace and truth." Eugene Peterson, in *The Message*, puts it this way: "The Word became flesh and blood, and moved into the neighborhood. We saw the glory with our own eyes, the one-of-a-kind glory, like Father, like Son, generous inside and out, true from start to finish." Tim Keller calls the incarnation, "The ideal becoming real." I don't know about you, but this utterly astonishes me with surprise.


Has the Christmas message become old hat to us? Oh, I pray not! What does a word do? It communicates, it reveals. Jesus communicates to us who God is so that we behold his glory. He has come in a way we can understand. In the flesh. Peterson calls it moving into the neighborhood. He comes to us. He doesn't expect that we come to him. This should all blow us away.

Scholar and theologian N.T. Wright puts it this way. "How can you live with the terrifying thought that the hurricane has become human, that the fire has become flesh, that life itself has walked into our midst? Christianity either means that or it means nothing. It is the most devastating disclosure of the deepest reality in the world or it is a sham, a total nonsense. Most people, unable to cope with saying either of those two things, are condemned to live in the shadow world in between."

Friends let's not live in the shadow world. May our lives be given to worshipping, "...this hurricane that has become human, this fire that has become flesh." May we continually be amazed that He has done all this for us, and may we recover our child-like wonder that we get to behold His glory.

May you all have a most Christ-filled Christmas!


Christmas Eve Service

Community Christmas Concert





Happy Birthday Party for Jesus





SHEDS OF HOPE

To honor our Father in Heaven, we commemorated the completion of our 100^{h} Shed of HOPE by posting Psalm 100 inside the back wall of the shed. As the psalm encourages us, we give thanks to God for making it possible for us to reach this milestone in 2021 and for the bountiful blessings he has showered upon the LOPC Sheds of HOPE ministry since we began building sheds in January 2017. What a privilege it is to serve our Lord by helping our brothers and sisters in need!







2021 has been another year of blessings and challenges for the LOPC Sheds of HOPE ministry. Within days of our first build in March, a large tornado struck the small town of Brent, AL. As it turned out, the sheds we built hadn't yet been unloaded at the MNA Disaster Response warehouse in Rome, GA; instead, the MNA response team took them straight to the disaster site and trained local setup teams while delivering and setting up the sheds for families who needed them.

Our young friends who joined us for our first Youth Build in April proved to be quick learners and hard workers – and they had fun! We enjoyed meeting and getting to know them, and we appreciated their help. We were especially pleased that they helped us complete our 100th Shed of HOPE during the weekend. More Youth Builds are planned in the future.

Our greatest challenge this year reared its head in June. When supplier bids for materials came in, due to the sharp increase in prices of building materials had nearly doubled our cost. This depleted our available funds, casting doubt on our ability to complete shed builds scheduled for 2021. But God had a plan. When we requested permission from the LOPC Session to conduct a fundraiser, the Session not only approved our request – they appropriated \$5,000 "seed money." Reviewing projected costs, we set a goal of \$25,000 which we felt would provide for 2021 and help continue building in 2022. But God had bigger plans – thanks to his providence and the generosity and support of the LOPC congregation, total funds raised exceeded \$35,000!

We were blessed to have representatives from a PCA church in the Birmingham, AL, area join us for our November shed build. They are planning to create a disaster response ministry including building Sheds of HOPE. They visited us on the recommendation of MNA Disaster Response to gain first-hand experience in building sheds. We enjoyed meeting and getting to know them by working and enjoying fellowship together. We hosted a similar visit from a PCA church in Auburn, AL, last year. It's a privilege to be able to share the Sheds of HOPE

experience with new friends and help build the church-wide ministry.

The LOPC Sheds of HOPE team built 24 shed kits this year, bringing our overall total to 118 shed kits. We're pleased and humbled to report that the Sheds of HOPE ministry is healthy and well positioned to continue our service. We are blessed not only with financial resources but in so many other ways, including the talent and dedication of our volunteers and your prayers and encouragement. We look forward to continuing to serve our Lord by helping our brothers and sisters in need.


