God's Passion for His Church

God amazes me with the way He works. Think about it for a second. God is all-powerful, Almighty, all-knowing, all-wise. He is completely sovereign over the universe. Psalm 33:6 says, "By the word of the LORD the heavens were made, and by the breath of his mouth all his host." All He did was to breathe, and out came the universe. Pretty amazing! Even more amazing to me is that this God who can do anything chooses to accomplish His work in the world through the church. God, who could simply accomplish His redemptive kingdom purposes simply through breathing, chooses to use you and me - the church - as His means or agents of redemption. When we talk about being missional, let us never forget that being missional begins with the fact that God has a mission. The church is here to serve God's mission.

During the month of February, we celebrate Valentine's Day. Valentine's Day is all about love. Now, that can be a happy topic for many, but it can also be a difficult topic. But I want to encourage you with something here for a minute. How much does God love the church? What is God's passion for the church? Let's take a look.

One of the images used in Scripture to depict the church is the temple in the Old Testament. The temple, built by King Solomon, had as its purpose to be a place for God's Name to dwell. God chose the temple to be a dwelling place for Himself. It would be where He would reveal His glory and from where He would demonstrate His rule in the world. Solomon's prayer of dedication gives us a vision of the temple as God's dwelling place. In 2 Chronicles 6 we read, "But will God really dwell on earth with men? The heavens, even the highest heavens,

cannot contain you. How much less this temple I have built! Yet give attention to your servant's prayer and his plea for mercy, O LORD my God. Hear the cry and the prayer that your servant is praying in your presence. May your eyes be open toward this temple day and night, this place of which you said you would put your Name there." And later we read after Solomon finished his prayer of dedication, "When Solomon finished praying, fire came down from heaven and consumed the burnt offering and the sacrifices, and the glory of the LORD filled the temple. The priests could not enter the temple of the LORD because the glory of the LORD filled it. When all the Israelites saw the fire coming down and the glory of the LORD above the temple, they knelt on the pavement with their faces to the ground, and they worshiped and gave thanks to the LORD, saying, "He is good; his love endures forever."

The New Testament tells us that we, as Christians, are the temple of God. "For we are the temple of the living God. As God has said: "I will live with them and walk among them, and I will be their God, and they will be my people." How would you like to come to church this next Sunday and see fire come down from heaven? This is God's vision for the church. That His glory and power would dwell with His people in such a way that it would be like fire from heaven. God's vision is that the church would be the place for His glory to dwell and be revealed to the world.

How are we doing at revealing His glory? Is this our vision for the church and our commitment to the church? How should we respond? We learn a little later in a very famous verse that is often quoted from 2 Chronicles, "If my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then will I hear from heaven and will forgive their sin and will heal their land. Now my eyes will be open and my ears attentive to the prayers offered in this place. I have chosen and consecrated this temple so that my Name may be there forever. My eyes and my heart will always be there."

Do we realize that this instruction is for the church? It is for Christians. It is instruction to Christians to humble themselves, pray, seek the face of God, and turn from their wicked ways. Is this what we are committed to? Is this what we have a passion for? It needs to be. And listen to God's promise. God longs for the church to live this way. He says if the church will be committed to these things, He promises to not only forgive but also to heal and to dwell with us. Glory. Fire from heaven. This is God's passion for the church. He wants the church to be His power center for revealing Himself and ministering to the world. He wants the church to be His agents of bringing about His kingdom, His rule and reign. He wants the church to be where His invisible rule and reign is made visible for all to see. Is this your vision for the church? Are you on the same page as your Lord?

How do you get on the same page? Well, as with everything, it begins with your mindset. How you think about things will always determine how you live. It is why Paul said we are transformed by the renewing of our minds. So, we must have this perspective, this mindset, when it comes to the church. And, lastly, we must see this is why Christ died for the church. His passion was enough that our Lord was willing to give His life for the church to accomplish this vision. Paul says in Ephesians 5, "Husbands love your wives, just as Christ loved the church

and gave Himself up for her, to make her holy, cleansing her by the washing with water through the word, and to present her to Himself as a radiant church, without stain or wrinkle or any other blemish, but holy and blameless."

God's passion for the church? His passion led Him to send His Son, Jesus, to die for her and to make her radiant and beautiful. God sees His church as a beautiful bride, spectacularly radiant, without spot or blemish. And we are His church. He is everyday making us more beautiful for Himself.

Do you have the same passion for the church that God does?



Children's Ministry




