What to Pray For

For this reason I bow my knees before the Father, from whom every family in heaven and on earth is named, that according to the riches of his glory he may grant you to be strengthened with power through his Spirit in your inner being, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith – that you, being rooted and grounded in love, may have strength to comprehend with all the saints what is the breadth and length and height and depth, and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, that you may be filled with all the fullness of God (Ephesians 3:14-19).

As I am currently writing this, it is Valentine's Day, and as we all know, Valentine's Day is all about love. But, if we are honest, we all have different experiences with love. Not all of us have the fairy-tale, picture-perfect life that hallmark cards like to convey. Again, if we are honest, these thoughts from Dan Allender's seminal book, *Bold Love*, ought to resonate with us:

All of us want out sometimes. Love is too hard; forgiveness seems impossible. Why try when our efforts to love seem to make matters worse? Even in our best relationships, the wounds of the battle hardly seem worth it sometimes. But it's hard for a human heart to live long or well without love. Love offers life. It softens the dark moments and keeps the heartbeat of hope alive. Love is both a mysterious friend and, at times, a terrible disappointment. Love one day satisfies and the next seems to strip the heart bare before the cold winds of betrayal. If we are honest, we often have mixed feelings about love.

Which brings us to our passage here in Ephesians 3. Notice, first, that this is what the Apostle Paul prays for us. He is praying for our ability to understand how loved we are. For only to the degree that we understand how loved we are will we be able to love others. Let's prime our hearts with some of Paul's language here. He prays specifically, that, according to the riches of his glory, he may grant you to be strengthened with power through his Spirit in your inner being, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith. Isn't that amazing! First, according to the riches of God's glory. How much are the riches of God's glory? Well, to begin with, think of God as Creator. We have our own planet, then the solar system and galaxy. Then, how many galaxies are there actually? There have been estimates that there could be upwards of a trillion galaxies. How big is God's glory? Incomprehensible! Then, according to the riches of his glory, he prays that we would be strengthened with power so that Christ would dwell in our hearts through faith. That is, because our only ability to love comes from abiding in our union with Christ.

Then, he prays, that you, being rooted and grounded in love, may have strength to comprehend with all the saints what is the breadth and length and height and depth, and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, that you may be filled with all the fullness of God. Paul's prayer is that we, both individually and as a church, would comprehend the fullness of God's love which surpasses knowledge itself. That means if we say we really understand God's love for us we are being dishonest with ourselves. None of us really gets God's love. Thus, this is our greatest need to pray for and to seek. We need to pray to understand more deeply the love that God has for us in Christ.

And what is the key to understanding God's love for us? Again, Allender is instructive. He writes,

Love is dependent on forgiveness. A formula can almost be structured from this concept. The extent to which someone truly loves will be positively correlated to the degree the person is stunned and silenced by the wonder that his huge debt has been canceled.

And this is what Paul prays for us. Which leads me to wonder: how much time do you spend praying for yourself and others to understand God's love? Is this a focus of your prayer life? And if not, why not? Have you ever considered it? Maybe, it's because, at least consciously, we do not consider the debt that has been canceled by Christ's work on the cross to be all that huge. Maybe as we exit another Valentine's week and enter into the season of Lent leading to Holy Week and Easter, it would do us well to focus on the wonder of God's love.

Combined Sunday School on February 18


Come hear from our global partners!
