#### Welcome to 2024

Welcome everyone to 2024! It's hard to believe I actually wrote that. But it is true. 2024 is here and I wish you all a most blessed and joy-filled New Year. I must admit I love the new year for many reasons. First, I love new beginnings. It

gives me an opportunity to do a heart check and a heart reset.

Now, I say *reset* of my heart rather than *resolutions* that I know I won't be able to keep. I am not speaking against resolutions. For many resolutions work very well, but for me, I can sometimes make it to mid-January, but by then I am slipping, and eventually they just sort of fade away. But a heart reset is different. 
