A Missional Church (II)

Yes, I am away but I thought I would take a moment and share a few thoughts with you. Psalm 57:9 says, "I will give thanks to you, O Lord, among the peoples; I will sing praises to you among the nations." I have so much to be thankful for. I am thankful for each of you, to live and serve with and among you. I am thankful for my family and friends, and for my country as we approach the Fourth of July holiday.

Above all else, I am thankful for the salvation that was given me by Christ and for my life in Christ. Jesus said, "The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life and have it abundantly," (John 10:10).

Which brings me to last week's historic decision by the Supreme Court to overturn the Roe v. Wade ruling which legalized abortion in this country, and to send it to the states to decide. First, I am thankful for this decision in favor of life. I am thankful for all the prayers and work that has gone on over the last fifty years to advocate for life. I feel like this is the right decision, that we should always be a church that stands for the sanctity of human life.

Which brings me to another point. Let me speak into this for a moment. Where do we go from here? What's next? I believe that now is the opportunity for the church to be the church. As my friend and PCA pastor, Mike Khandjian, puts it, "This is a call for the Church to be the Church rather than a political arm – our first mission is to the gospel, a message that meets sinners where they are in the Name of Jesus. If our celebration is louder than our mission, then we have failed." I agree with that. This is an opportunity for the church to truly be missional.

And what is our mission? We are to stand for and advocate for life. For all of life. Remember Jesus' words, "I came that they may have life and have it abundantly." Scott Sauls, another PCA pastor, in his writing on this issue challenges us, "Perhaps the loudest outcry from pro-choice men and women against the recent Supreme Court decision to overturn Roe v. Wade is that, according to them, the so-called pro-life position seems focused on only one kind of life: infant life. The question is fairly asked: Why has pro-life messaging not accounted for other realities?"

I think, at the very least, we should listen to this outcry. What are a few things we can do? First, we need to keep our focus on the gospel of grace. The only hope for us and for the world is in the gospel of Christ. Our mission is to bring the transforming power of the gospel to our community. We need to remember and to proclaim that there is no sin that cannot be forgiven and covered by the gospel of Christ. Our vision is for our church to be a haven of grace. We want to be a place where we compassionately listen to everyone's story, to remember that everyone has a story and that everyone has been wounded by the Fall. It is a time for the Church to remember.

Second, it is also a time for the Church to continue to advocate for life. One of the things that I find most encouraging is how it has been the work of so many Christians to work in and support adoption, foster care, and crisis pregnancy centers. Now is not the time to stop. One of the things that attracted me to LOPC when I was seeking a call was the commitment to love and serve the community. Now is not the time to stop, but rather to double down, so to speak, in that commitment. I don't know specifically where the Lord may lead LOPC in this, but I do know that part of our missional call is to come alongside the most wounded and vulnerable of our community. This reflects the heart of Christ, and we are called to reflect His heart in loving our community. I have no doubt that we will want to partner with our centers and ministries who are coming alongside single moms, pregnant teens, and the most vulnerable of our community.

Lastly, as always, it is a time to pray. It is a time to pray for peace. It is a time to pray for the Church to be the Church. And it is a time to pray for LOPC to follow our Lord continually in His mission to bring healing, renewal, and peace to the Lake Oconee area.

Women's Ministry




