

I love being a part of a church that throws great parties. And this past Sunday was one of the best. My first word of thanks is to the Fellowship Team, Deacons, and everyone who made this celebration possible.

If you were here on Sunday, you experienced the reopening of our refreshed Narthex and Sanctuary. Wow! Again, I love being a part of a church that is committed to displaying the beauty of our Lord. We want our physical facilities to be able to be used to serve the ministry goal of gospel transformation that we have, and our refreshed narthex and sanctuary are incredible. Again, a huge word of thanks to our Facilities Task Force of Bob Patton, Tommy Evans, Dick Forrester, Brent Johansen, Gale Weaver, Cornealia Patton, as well as the Deacons and everyone who helped moving all the furniture out of and then back into the sanctuary.

Now that we are back in the narthex and sanctuary, let me again give us some reminders as to why we are making these renovations. How do they serve the

vision and mission of being rooted in the gospel in order to reach Lake Oconee to bring renewal to the world?

The following is from our Facilities Task Force as they carry out their commission as given by our session:

As we have shared before, we've had the privilege of working with Lindsay Hoffman, who is a godly woman and a very talented designer out of Atlanta. Our LOPC 2.0 design theme has been to make our church lighter, brighter and more welcoming to the community we serve. Following are the changes you will see.


- Narthex: LOPC 2.0 is a call to be more missional, to be more outward focused. Everything we are doing is in service to that mission, compelled by the love of Christ and motivated by a desire to be obedient to scripture. Christian research tells us that visitors make a decision about a church within the first 2-5 minutes. We want our Narthex to serve less as an information center and more as a true welcome center. For this reason, the LOPC Session approved a plan to create a coffee bar environment in our Narthex where visitors and our members can grab a cup of coffee and a pastry and mingle with one another. Community connection and Christian fellowship is our highest priority for this space. Our walls will be painted swiss coffee and our trim will be painted urban bronze to match the exterior color theme. We will put down commercial grade LVT (luxury vinyl tile) in a herringbone pattern and we will update our ceiling tiles.
- Sanctuary: Our sanctuary design will continue the theme of lighter, brighter with a focus on maintaining the recessed area that houses our cross and our stain glassed window as the centerpiece of this beautiful room. We will paint the walls in our Sanctuary swiss coffee and the trim urban bronze. We will also update our flooring by applying the same LVT product in the Sanctuary as in the Narthex in a standard, straight pattern. There are many reasons we selected this commercial grade LVT flooring. LVT is easy to clean, doesn't stain, and is far more sanitary than carpet when dealing with spills which is important given the fact that our sanctuary is a multi-purpose facility. LVT is also scratch and scuff resistant. Lastly, our LVT is 5mm thick and has strong sound and acoustic performance. We have re-carpeted our chancel and we have expanded our choir area. The piano has been moved to the sanctuary floor, realigning our choir to face the congregation directly and by so doing we will significantly increase our choir capacity. Our praise team will go to wireless microphones, and we will streamline our chancel area to promote better engagement between those leading our worship and our congregation. Lastly, we have re-tinted our sanctuary windows to allow of us to enjoy our beautiful windows while managing light.
- We will be replacing the chairs in our sanctuary as our current chairs are over 20 years old and many are worn and /or faded. Our new chairs are on order, and we expect them to arrive by the end of the summer.

I hope you are as excited as I am about what God is doing in our church and in our community. Thank you again for all the many ways you are supporting our LOPC 2.0 vision to be a missional church and to be a light for Jesus Christ in our

community.
