Father of Mercies

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our affliction, so that we may be able to comfort those who are in any affliction, with the comfort with which we ourselves are comforted by God. For as we share abundantly in Christ's sufferings, so through Christ we share abundantly in comfort too," (2 Corinthians 1:3-5).

As I write this, Evie and I have been impacted by the news of recent events, we struggle to know exactly how to respond and how to feel. Yes, we pray, but we long for so much more. Evie and I were blessed to spend almost two weeks several years ago in Ukraine ministering with and among the lovely believers in that country. So, we know many personally who are currently going through this terrible affliction.

In the midst of our own feeling of helplessness and powerlessness, Evie came across this prayer that was written by a dear friend and former staff member of Campus Outreach, Ashley Marivittori Gorman. The prayer begins, "Father of

mercies: I don't know what to do, but I know that your reflexive compassion for the downtrodden, blindsided, wounded, oppressed, and mourning is not in short supply tonight. I pray it would pour out in undeniable ways on the men, women, and children who have no other hope but your help. Flood them with your consolation that is both tender and strong in our weakest moments. As I know well, there is no presence like yours. And so, I petition you to show yourself as the God of all comfort you are."

This prayer beautifully expresses the heart of what the Apostle Paul was conveying to the church at Corinth. There is so much we don't know. There is so much we don't understand. We struggle with wanting to do something, feel somehow in control, but we feel helpless and powerless. But we're not. We know the heart of God. We know that God is the Father of mercies and the God of all comfort. We know that Jesus is Immanuel, God with us. And we know that prayer calls down the King's power to intervene in the affairs of life.

So, we are not powerless. We pray. We repent of our self-reliance and our attempts at controlling. We repent at our incessant need to understand everything. Lord, we boldly come before your throne of grace, knowing that as we pray you are changing us, changing your people, making us the outpost of heaven in the midst of terrible darkness.



We are asking that you pray about the calling of these two staff additions, for wisdom for the session as we seek the right person for each position. And, as this will involve an increase in our budget, we are asking for you to get behind this vision with your prayers and support.

It is such a joy and privilege to be able to serve with and among you. I consider it an honor to be your pastor, and I am excited for what God has in store for us. Even as we are honest about events in our world, we know that there is also much to be hopeful about. I can't help but think this is what it means to be the church in the world.




