

Hi, ladies:



Sheds of HOPE

We were pleased that several students from local schools joined us April 23 for our first Sheds of HOPE Youth Build. They were interested, learned quickly, worked hard and made a real contribution to the day's work. And by all accounts, everyone had fun!

With these four sheds completed, the LOPC Sheds of HOPE team has built 98 shed kits. Since the beginning of the LOPC Sheds of HOPE ministry, our sheds have been given to families in need in GA, SC, NC, FL, AL, LA and TN. We have trained Sheds of HOPE volunteers from other churches across the southeast and we helped train a team of volunteers from GA Tech during an event at the MNA Disaster Response warehouse in Rome, GA.

God has richly blessed the LOPC Sheds of HOPE ministry in countless ways, including the talent, expertise and experience of our volunteers; the moral and financial support of the LOPC congregation and community; the invaluable behind-the-scenes work of the church staff; the support of local suppliers and vendors; and the financial support we've received from MNA Disaster Response and our church community. This financial support has become even more important as the cost of materials rises sharply in today's economy.
