

Jesus' Heart

But now I am coming to you, and these things I speak in the world, that they may have my joy fulfilled in themselves...As you sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world...The glory that you have given me I have given to them, that they may be one even as we are one, I in them and you in me, that they may become perfectly one, so that the world may know that you sent me and loved them even as you loved me. (John 17:13,18,22-23)

This is going to be a very significant summer in the life of our church, and I wanted to write to you to celebrate with you where God has brought us, encourage you as we move forward, and share with you some of the significant things going on.

Last fall, we launched LOPC 2.0, a campaign designed to revitalize us as a church in what we have always been about, the commission God has given us to make disciples of all nations (Matthew 28:18-20). We began to implement a vision where our desire was to see God work in our lives, church, and community to bring spiritual renewal and restoration to Lake Oconee. We wanted to join God in His mission of bringing the gospel to Lake Oconee with

the hope of seeing God bring renewal, healing, and peace to our community for His glory. One way we have of stating this vision is *rooted in the gospel for the renewal of the world*.

And we have seen God work in some amazing ways. We have been blessed to see God's faithfulness in bringing us an amazing staff in Mike and Whitney and Travis and Ellen, and we anticipate in the coming months bringing on a new worship leader to help us launch a second service, geared to reaching our community with the gospel. We experienced an incredible family movie night with over 100 people in attendance. Travis has been given opportunities to develop relationships with youth, both in our church, and in the community through involvement with the LOA football team and FCA events. Mike is getting ready to unveil a revitalized small group ministry to not only help us *grow* in our faith, but also to *go* with our faith to our friends and neighbors. There is much to celebrate as a church family. God is on the move.

When we held our meetings last fall in many of our homes, we mentioned that there were two main planks of LOPC 2.0. One was the hiring of staff. The other was to refresh and update our facilities. You have already experienced the amazing work done on the exterior of the church. This has created quite a buzz. We have already had many in the community comment on how incredible the outside of the building looks.

The reason behind this update is twofold. One was that the building is twenty years old, and part of our responsibility is to be stewards of the wonderful building that God has blessed us with. There are aspects of the building that needed updating for us to continue to provide our beautiful, classical 10:30 worship service, while building our second service. The second reason is that everything we have and everything we do is to be used to serve God's mission. Thus, as we stated, LOPC 2.0 is a call to obedience. We are simply striving to be faithful to God's call. And God's mission is outward focused. As my former seminary professor, Harvie Conn, said, "The church is the only institution that exists for the sake of its non-members." Thus, the purpose of our building and facilities is not to serve ourselves or our preferences, but it is for the purpose of connecting to and loving our community. Thus, as we refresh and update our building, we do so with the express purpose of how this will attract, be relevant to, and connect with our current community here in 2023, a community, which, as we shared, has grown considerably younger. So, the updates that are being made are being made for the purpose of connecting with and bringing into the church younger families, so that we together, as a family of disciples, can serve the next generation.

So, what specifically will we be doing through the summer? Later in the summer, we plan on redesigning and refreshing spaces used for adult education, children's education, and to have a dedicated youth space. And, very importantly, we need to ensure that young families feel secure and safe when they entrust us with their children. This is simply a part of loving people and our community well.

During May, work will be done in the narthex and sanctuary:

 During the week of May 15th, the audio and visual system and lighting will be updated.

- On Sunday May 21st, you will experience our first worship service with the new equipment. Immediately following worship on May 21st, we would like to invite you to an informational congregational meeting to continue our communication with you and answer any questions you may have.
- The week of **May 22nd** is when the flooring in the narthex and sanctuary will be done.
- On Sunday May 28th, we will have an outdoor worship service down in the
 pavilion followed by a Memorial Day picnic where we hope we can invite
 family, friends, and neighbors to enjoy not only worship but fellowship with
 us. Again, this is a wonderful time to connect relationally with our
 community.
- The week of May 29th is when the painting will be completed.
- Sunday, **June 4th**, will be our grand re-opening celebrating together the goodness of the Lord.

This is a wonderful opportunity for us, but with every opportunity there is also considerable risk. I implore us to be in prayer, not only for the work but for our hearts, as well. We recognize that change is hard. Change always involves loss of some kind. But I am calling us to remember why we are doing this. Jesus, in the passage I cited at the beginning of this article, in His High Priestly prayer, states that He wishes for us to have His own joy fulfilled in us. Jesus' heart for us is joy. And then He goes on to say that as the Father sent Him into the world, He has sent us into the world. There seems to be a connection there between our experiencing Jesus' joy and being sent. The more we are a family on mission together, the more joy we will experience. And, as Jesus then prayed, He asked that we would experience unity for the express purpose that the world may know that the Father sent Jesus. Our putting aside our preferences for the sake of unity is, itself, missional.

May Jesus' joy truly be in you as we together serve Lake Oconee for the glory of God.



Children's Ministry






