Running the Race

Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God (Hebrews 12:1-2).

One of the reasons I love sports as I do is that I am reminded of the many lessons my dad taught me using sports. Whether it was golf and learning things like patience (I'm not sure how well I learned that lesson) or the teamwork of basketball, I have learned a lot through sports.

My favorite sport has always been baseball. Are you tiring yet of my constantly talking about the NY Yankees? I hope not. One of the things that I have always loved about baseball is the length of the season and the fact that it is not a sprint but a marathon. For so many, 162 games is too long of a season, but I love the fact that a team is tested through a six-month season, having to endure ups and

downs, peaks and valleys, and must endure in order to win.

In Hebrews 12, the writer is encouraging the people of God to endure in running the race. He is comparing life to a race and lets us see just a couple of lessons for us here in this passage. First, notice the text says, “the race that is set before us.” In other words, while we run the race it is one that is set before us, in other words by God. He writes and defines our race for us. It is not up to us. That ought to be very freeing for us. We are not in control of our own race. In fact, it is not our race to define, write, or control. What does the first question of the Heidelberg Catechism say? “What is your only comfort in life and in death? That I, with body and soul, both in life and in death, am not my own, but belong to my faithful Savior Jesus Christ.” Take heart, my friends.

And how do we run this race? Again, we are told that the key is “looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross.” Jesus ran a race, too. And where did His race lead? To the cross. And what was it that compelled Him toward the cross? The text tells us that it was for the joy that was set before him. Part of that joy was us, you and me. As the bride of Christ, we are His joy.

Does that move you? I hope so. That is incredible. We are Christ’s joy. It is only that promise of the gospel that can strengthen us to run the race that is set before us, wherever it may lead. Christ ran a race first. A race that was set before Him. A race that led to the cross and led to our eternal security in Him.

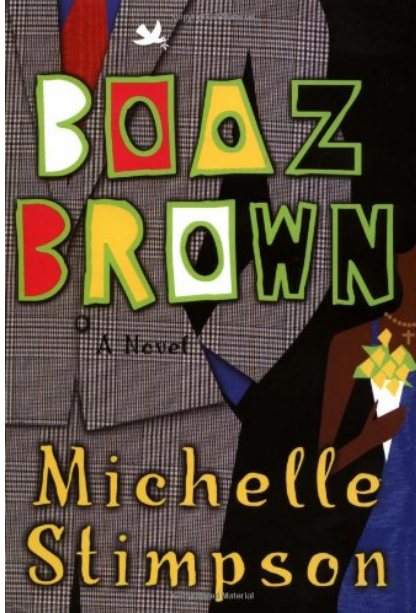

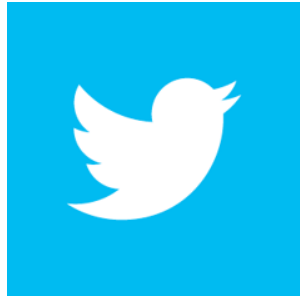

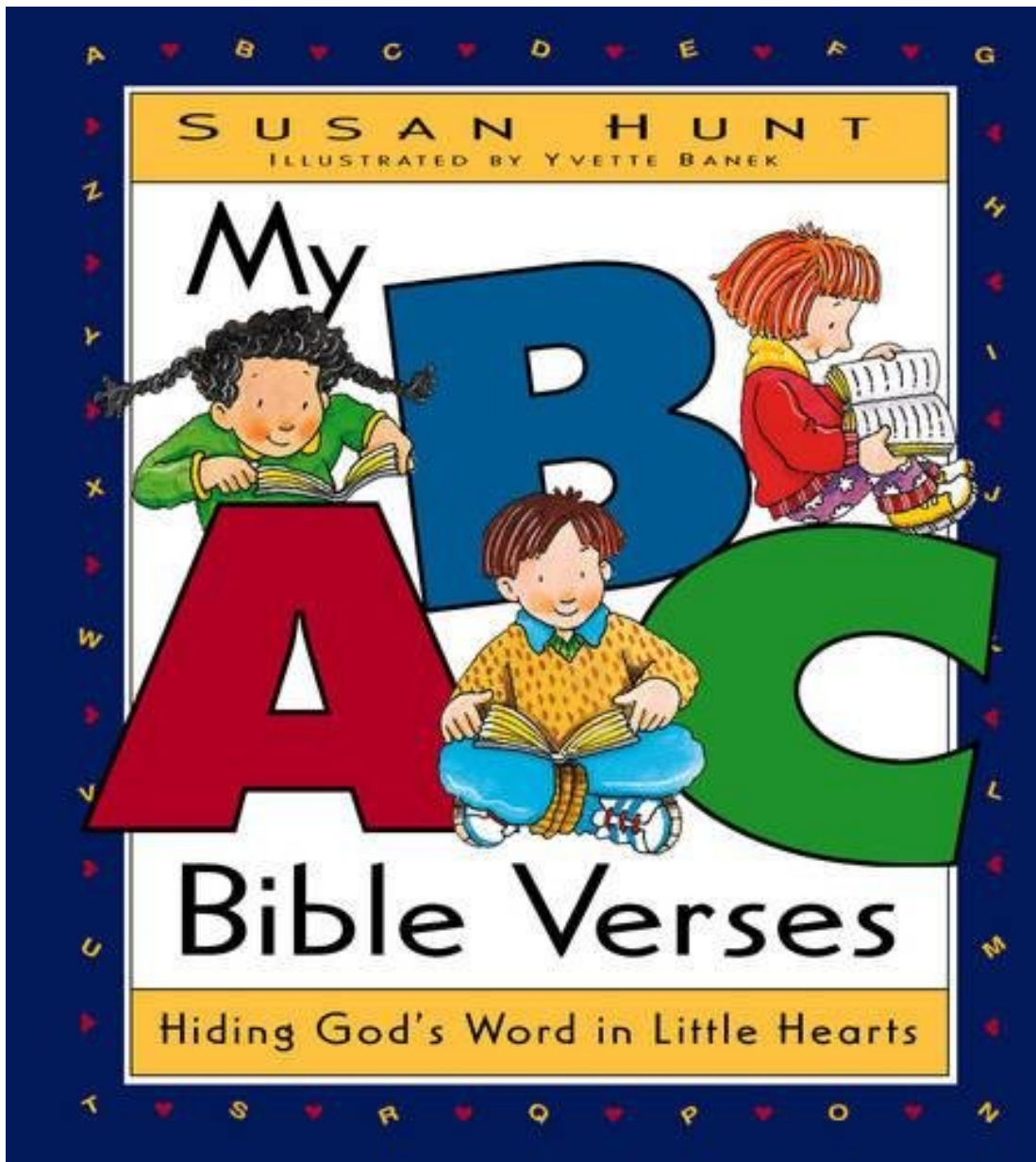
Youth Ministry
