The Church as Witnesses

The dictionary definition of a witness is "to see, hear, or know by personal presence and perception." Also, "to testify to, give or afford evidence of." In Isaiah 43:10 we read, "You are my witnesses, declared the LORD, and my servant whom I have chosen, that you may know and believe me and understand that I am he. Before me no god was formed, nor shall there be any after me."

The church receives this role as the new Israel right before Jesus' ascension when He commissions His apostles in Acts 1:8. "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you. And you will be my witnesses, telling people about me everywhere - in Jerusalem, throughout Judea, in Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

As the church, the new Israel, we receive the same call and commission that they did: to witness to the reality of God. Having seen, heard and known by personal presence and perception, we are to testify, to give and to afford evidence of the reality of God. Our lives and testimony, in other words, our words and deeds, life

and actions, should give evidence that there is no other God, that there never has been and there never will be. As Isaiah puts it, we have been chosen to know God, believe in God, and understand that God alone is God.

Amazing! What a call! What a commission! Our lives, our relationships, our attitudes, our actions, our demeanors, our words, everything about us is called to represent to the world that God is God. That is what it means to be different. To be set apart. To be holy.

What are some of the implications of this role? I have to be careful here, for there are so many, but for now let me mention just a couple. First, everything we do has a missional aspect to it. That is, everything we do, both as individuals and as a body, is done representing God. We embody the reality and truth of God everywhere in our daily lives.

That means we represent God to a watching world at home, in our neighborhood, at school or work, in what we say or do in all our social networking. This means we should always be checking our attitudes, words and actions. What does what we say or how we come across reveal about God? We are always witnessing to the God we profess, either truthfully to who He really is, or we are giving a false or distorted witness.

Also, this means that everything we do is for the purpose of bringing and representing God to others. We do not do anything for ourselves. Our decisions, if they are to glorify God, should be governed by how they affect others. We should be asking questions like, *Will what we are doing reveal and proclaim God to our community? Will this help Greene County and Putnam County to come to know the reality of God?*

This lies at the heart of what Paul spoke to the Ephesians about when he said, "So that through the church the manifold wisdom of God might now be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly places." (Ephesians 3:10)

As it says in Isaiah, we are God's servants, chosen to know, believe and understand that He is God. What an awesome privilege to be chosen to be kingdom servants - to display through our ministry of word and ministry of deed the manifold wisdom of God.






Mid-morning Ladies' Bible Study

volunteers are welcome!



Sunday Nursery Update

Beginning September 5, our Sunday nursery will be suspended for a period of time. This decision has been made by Session after considering the following:

- The current nursery director, Johna Unger, is stepping down effective this Sunday. LOPC has been blessed to have Johna serve faithfully in this position for ten years. During the past several months, we tried to find volunteer(s) to serve as nursery director without success.
- An analysis of the nursery usage revealed only seven (7) children were in the nursery since reopening on June 6th, for a total of 12 Sundays. Eight (8) of those Sundays (67 %) had zero attendance, including the last six consecutive Sundays. It is likely the last six Sundays' zero (0) attendance reflect parent/grandparents' reluctance to place children in the nursery due to the Covid Delta variant.
- In addition, the two (2) nursery workers currently employed have given us notice that they will be working fewer Sundays starting in September.

Coupling these facts with the cost of paying two (2) nursery workers each Sunday, the decision was made to pause the nursery. Consideration will be given to reopening the nursery contingent on the return to Sunday school. The date for re-opening Sunday school has not been determined.
