Why Is Change so Hard?

The phrase *Ecclesia reformata, semper reformanda* means, "The church reformed, always reforming." The phrase comes from the Reformation era and is part of our reformed heritage. Often misunderstood, it doesn't mean that we support all change or innovation, such as theological or doctrinal compromise, but it does get at an important truth.

Our reformed tradition does, in fact, embrace change, or reformation of the church for the sake of the gospel. In fact, the word *reformed* refers to the desire to reform the church so that we are growing more Christlike and more effective in fulfilling God's mission of reaching our communities for Christ.

A very important Scripture in all of this is found in Paul's first letter to the Corinthians (which by the way we are currently reading in our Community Bible Reading). The context is Paul speaking of how he is willing to surrender his rights for the sake of the gospel. He says in 1 Cor. 9:16, "Woe to me if I do not preach the gospel." Then he writes, beginning in v.19 of the same chapter, "For though I am free from all, I have made myself a servant to all, that I might win more of them. To the Jews I became as a Jew, in order to win Jews. To those under the law I became as one under the law (though not being myself under the law) that I might win those under the law. To those outside the law I became as one outside the law (not being outside the law of God but under the law of Christ) that I might win those outside the law. To the weak I became weak, that I might win the weak. I have become all things to all people, that by all means I might save some. I do it all for the sake of the gospel, that I may share with them in its blessings," (1 Cor. 9:19-23).

Do you notice how many times Paul says something to the effect of, "that I might win them," or "for the sake of the gospel"? Paul's primary concern is that he might be used by God to reach those who do not yet know Christ, that they may be saved. When he says, "I become like a Jew, or those under the law, or those outside the law," he is saying he is willing to sacrifice or give up his rights, his preferences, what might be legitimately his for the greater good of winning others to Christ.

Harvie Conn, in his book *Evangelism: Doing Justice and Preaching Grace* writes, "One cannot be a missionary church and continue insisting that the world must come to the church on the church's terms. It must become a "go" structure.... The church must recapture its identity as the only organization in the world that exists for the sake of its nonmembers."

So, friends being missional is not an option. It is obedience. God calls us to this. This is our identity. I believe Dr. Conn is right. The church is the only organization that exists for the sake of its nonmembers. There are implications to living out this conviction. It means change. And change is hard. We all like the way we do things. The status quo seems comfortable and familiar. We all love our preferences.

But I must challenge, don't we want to align our desires with the Scriptures? Isn't obedience more important than our comfort? Of course, we do not want ever to compromise the gospel. Our doctrine is non-negotiable. But isn't what Paul is speaking about here in 1Cor. 9 part of our doctrine? And doesn't our reformation heritage encourage us to be continually reforming? I know these are tough questions and difficult issues, but they are very important for us to wrestle with if we are to be obedient to Christ's command for us to, "Go and make disciples of all nations," (Matt. 28:18-20).

Change is hard. I get that, and I do sympathize. But these are exciting times here at LOPC and I believe God has a rich and exciting future ahead for us. I am excited to join with you in the adventure of joining God in His mission to reach this community for Christ and to be used by Him in bringing renewal, healing, and peace to Lake Oconee for the glory of God.




Women Connecting to Women in Prayer
